ORDER ACKNOWLEDGING INDEXING AND PASS-THROUGH RATE ADJUSTMENTS

BY THE COMMISSION:

On July 5, 1989, Southern States Utilities, Inc. (Utility) notified this Commission of its intention to increase rates to the customers of its Western Shores, Palms Mobile Home Park, Fern Terrace - Leesburg, Spring Lake Manor/Piney Woods, Picciola Island, Skycrest, Hobby Hills, East Lake Harris, Carlton Village, Stone Mountain, Friendly Center, Morningview, Venetian Village, Holiday Haven, Silver Lakes Estates and Sunshine Parkway systems in Lake County by application of the price-indexing and pass-through provisions of Subsections 367.081(4)(a) and (b), Florida Statutes, respectively, and Rules 25-30.420 and 25-30.425, Florida Administrative Code, respectively.

By Order No. 20972, issued by this Commission on March 31, 1989, in Docket No. 890005-WS, the rates of water and sewer utilities are subject to adjustment as a result of the application of the price index to certain utility operation and maintenance costs. The indexing factor is 4.35 percent.

Southern States intends to pass through a decrease in the water testing required by the Department Environmental Regulation and an increase in its ad valorem taxes to the customers of its Western Shores, Palms Mobile Home Park, Fern Terrace - Leesburg, Spring Lake Manor/Piney Woods, Picciola Island, Skycrest, Hobby Hills, East Lake Harris, Carlton Village, Stone Mountain, Friendly Center, Morningview and Venetian Village systems. The Utility also intends to pass through an increase in its ad valorem taxes to the customers of its Holiday Haven and Silver Lakes Estates systems. Southern States intends to pass through a decrease in its ad valorem taxes to the Sunshine Parkway system water customers and an increase in its ad valorem taxes to the Sunshine Parkway system sewer customers. The Utility waived its right to place the pass-through rates into effect thirty days from the filing date of this notice and states that these rates are to become effective simultaneously with the indexing adjustment.

The documentation submitted by the Utility in support of its indexing and pass-through notice meets the Commission's requirements, as set forth in Rules 25-30.420 and 25-30.425, Florida Administrative Code. In compliance with said rules, the Utility advised us that it will provide notice to its customers prior to the effective date of the rates, informing them of the impending rate adjustment and explaining that the increase is due to the pass-through provisions and the application of the price index to certain operation and maintenance expenses.

Applying increase factors of 1.0184 and 1.0251 to the existing rate schedules results in increased water and sewer revenues of \$3,631 and \$1,030, respectively, for Southera States' Western Shores, Palms Mobile Home Park, Fern Terrace -Leesburg, Spring Lake Manor/Piney Woods, Picciola Skycrest, Hobby Hills, East Lake Harris, Carlton Village, Stone Mountain, Friendly Center, Morningview and Venetian Village systems. Applying increase factors of 1.0130 and 1.0556 to the existing rate schedules results in increased water and sewer revenues of \$270 and \$675, respectively, for the Utility's Holiday Haven system. Applying an increase factor of 1.0147 to the existing rate schedules results in increased water revenues of \$1,680 for Southern States' Silver Lake Estates system. Applying increase factors of 1.0046 and 1.0084 to the existing rate schedules results in increased water and sewer revenues of \$125 and \$443, respectively, for the Sunshine Parkway system.
