ORDER ACKNOWLEDGING INDEXING AND PASS-THROUGH RATE ADJUSTMENTS

BY THE COMMISSION:

12, 1989, Southern States Utilities, Inc. On July (Utility) notified this Commission of its intention to increase rates to the customers of its Zephyr Shores System in Pasco County by application of the price-indexing and pass-through and (b), Florida provisions of Subsections 367.081(4)(a) Statutes, respectively, and Rules 25-30.420 and 25-30.425, Florida Administrative Code, respectively.

Although the application, as filed, meets the requirements of the above-mentioned Rules, it should be noted that Southern States pays a higher price for water puchased from Pasco County for the Zephyr Shores system than it does for its other system, Ell Nar, in Pasco County. The contract between the former owner of the Zephyr Shores system and Pasco County does not provide for the purchase of water at wholesale prices. Southern States is attempting to renegotiate the contract. In the event that Southern States and Pasco County are unable to reach an agreement, Southern States intends to run a water line from one of its other systems to the Zephyr Shores system. The difference in the cost of water does not affect the processing of this price index and pass-through rate adjustment for Southern States' Zephyr Shores system.

By Order No. 20972, issued by this Commission on March 31, 1989, in Docket No. 890005-WS, the rates of water and sewer utilities are subject to adjustment as a result of the application of the price index to certain utility operation and maintenance costs. The indexing factor is 4.35 percent.

The Utility also intends to pass through to its customers an increase in its ad valorem taxes. The Utility waived its right to place the pass-through rates into effect thirty days from the filing date of this notice and states that these rates are to become effective simultaneously with the indexing adjustment.

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The documentation submitted by the Utility in support of its indexing and pass-through notice meets the Commission's requirements, as set forth in Rules 25-30.420 and 25-30.425, Florida Administrative Code. In compliance with said rules, the Utility advised us that it will provide notice to its customers prior to the effective date of the rates, informing them of the impending rate adjustment and explaining that the increase is due to the pass-through provisions and the application of the price index to certain operation and maintenance expenses.

Applying increase factors of 1.0448 and 1.0769 to the existing rate schedules results in increased water and sewer revenues of \$1,282 and \$1,268, respectively. The schedules of our computations are as follows:
