ORDER GRANTING MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

BY THE COMMISSION:

On July 31, 1989, this Commission issued Order No. 21641, granting Malabar Woods Utilities, Inc. (Malabar Woods or Utility) Certificates Nos. 521-W and 455-S to provide service to territory in Brevard County, Florida. That Order also granted Malabar's request for extension of time until July 31, 1989, to file additional information needed for the establishment of rates and charges.

On July 19, 1989, Malabar Woods filed a Motion for Extension of Time to File Information Regarding Initial Rates and Charges. In its Motion, the Utility requested an additional 45 days (until September 14, 1989) to file the additional information. In support of its request, Malabar Woods stated that the property to which it proposes to provide water and sewer service has recently been sold. Since the new owner has not drawn up development plans, the Utility has been unable to accurately estimate the initial cost of constructing the facilities needed to serve the territory. We find Malabar Woods' argument to be persuasive and, therefore, grant the extension of time requested in the Motion.

25-22.038(2), Florida Administrative Code, if issued by a Prehearing Officer; 2) reconsideration within 15 days pursuant to Rule 25-22.060, Florida Administrative Code, if issued by the Commission; or 3) judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court, in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility, or the First District Court of Appeal, in the case of a water or sewer utility. A motion for reconsideration shall be filed with the Director, Division of Records and Reporting, in the form prescribed by Rule 25-22.060, Florida Administrative Code. Judicial review of a preliminary, procedural or intermediate ruling or order is available if review of the final action will not provide an adequate remedy. Such review may be requested from the appropriate court, as described above, pursuant to Rule 9.100, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
