MOTION TO ESTABLISH TESTIMONY DUE DATE

The Citizens of the State of Florida, through their attorney, the Public Counsel, file this Motion to establish May 7 as the date on which Intervenors in this docket and the Commission Staff will be required to file testimony. The Citizens submit:

- 1. The date on which the Commission requires testimony to be filed in a major rate case is of considerable importance to the Public Counsel for a number of reasons. In order to properly direct responsibilities to outside consultants, the Public Counsel must consider how the workload of a particular consultant coincides with the schedule of the case at hand. In addition, the timing of document productions (a one or two week undertaking which can be scheduled only at a date agreeable to the utility), as well as other discovery and in-house preparation, is driven by the expectation of the testimony due date.
 - 2. As of this writing, the Commission has not issued an order establishing the date on which testimony will be due.
 - 3. In Docket No. 881167-EI, before Gulf requested continuance of the proceedings, the Staff and Intervenor testimony was due thirty-eight days prior to the opening day of the hearings (March 24 and May 1, respectively). Applying that

same schedule to this docket would render a testimony due date of May 4, which falls on a Friday. The Citizens request the use of one additional weekend to prepare testimony, calling for a due date of May 7, 1990.
