## CASE BACKGROUND

Shady Oaks Mobile-Modular Estates, Inc., (Shady Oaks or utility) is a class "C" water and wastewater utility which serves a 242 lot mobile-modular home park in Pasco County, approximately 1-1/2 miles south of Zephyrhills. On January 10, 1990, Shady Oaks applied for the instant staff-assisted rate case. The Commission issued proposed agency action Order No. 24084 on February 8, 1991, granting Shady Oaks a rate increase. On March 1, 1991, several of the utility's customers caused to be filed a document entitled "Petition of Objection or Protest," a copy of which is attached and marked Exhibit "A." This recommendation concerns the disposition of this protest.

## DISCUSSION OF ISSUES

**<u>ISSUE 1</u>**: Should the Commission dismiss the protest to proposed agency action Order No. 24084? (Vandiver, Feil)

**<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>**: Yes, the Commission should dismiss the protest to proposed agency action Order No. 24084 because the basis of the protest is a matter outside of the Commission's jurisdiction.

**STAFF ANALYSIS:** In proposed agency action Order No. 24084, issued February 8, 1991, the Commission included costs associated with a proposed new percolation pond in the utility's rate base. In the "Petition of Objection or Protest" received March 1, 1991, approximately nine utility customers protest specifically and exclusively the location of the new percolation pond. Because the pond will be within 100 feet of their property, they allege that it will cause offensive odors and other health hazards and that it will decrease the value of their property.

As part of a March 7, 1989, Consent Final Judgment between the utility and the Department of Environmental Regulation (DER), the utility agreed to construct an additional effluent disposal system which would eliminate discharge from the utility's wastewater plant. DER issued the utility a permit for the construction of a new percolation pond. The DER permit approved the size and location of the pond and established a March 31, 1991, deadline for completion. (On March 1, 1991, DER gave the utility an extension for the pond's completion, until September 6, 1991.) This is the pond which the petitioning customers are complaining of.

Essentially, the petitioning customers allege that the location of the proposed pond will constitute a nuisance. Although Staff is sympathetic to the plight of the customers, it was DER, not the Commission, who approved the location of the new percolation pond. This was so because the Legislature gave DER, and not the Commission, subject matter jurisdiction for making such determinations. Thus, Staff recommends that the Commission find that the PSC does not have subject matter jurisdiction over what the petitioning customers are protesting.

Furthermore, it is the operation of the utility, and not the location of the percolation pond per se, which is the subject of the instant proceeding. The location and size of the pond was not approved, disapproved, or otherwise addressed in the protested order. The Commission's only involvement with the pond was in including its cost in rate base. Since the Commission made no determination whatsoever regarding the size or location of the proposed pond, nothing in the protested order affects the interests of the petitioning customers with regard to the location of the DOCKET NO. 900025-WS MARCH 21, 1991

pond. In essence, the protest is to a decision that the Commission did not make.

Therefore, based on the above discussion, Staff recommends that the protest be dismissed.

**<u>IBSUE 2</u>**: Should Order No. 24084 be revived and made final and effective?

**<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>**: Yes. (Feil)

**<u>STAFF ANALYSIS</u>**: If the Commission accepts Staff's recommendation in Issue 1, Order No. 24084 should be revived and made final and effective. No other protests to the Order were filed, so if the aforementioned protest is dismissed, the Order should become final.

**ISSUE 3:** Should the docket be closed?

**<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>**: No. This docket should remain open. (Vandiver)

**<u>STAFF ANALYSIS</u>**: Order No. 24084 required that Staff monitor the utility for several months, so the docket must remain open for that purpose.
