After sending you a letter last Tuesday I met with a representative of the Office of Statewide Prosecutor and the Attorney General's economic crimes unit. It is now our opinion that we would hinder their investigation of possible criminal activities by Southern Bell if we were to continue taking depositions in either docket 900960-TL or 910163-TL. We therefore do not want to go forward with the depositions set for April 10-11 in Miami and ask you to likewise consider canceling those depositions.
