ORDER CLOSING DOCKET

BY THE COMMISSION:

NOTICE is hereby given by the Florida Public Service Commission that the action discussed herein is preliminary in nature and will become final unless a person whose interests are adversely affected files a petition for a formal proceeding, pursuant to Rule 25-22.029, Florida Administrative Code.

On July 16, 1990, in Order No. 23187, we required Palm Beach County Utilities Corporation (PBCUC or the Company) to file Modified Minimum Filing Requirements (MMFRs) by September 30, 1990. On petition by the Company, we amended the due date for filing the MMFRs to March 31, 1991 (Order No. 23584, October 4, 1990). PBCUC filed its MMFRs on March 29, 1991, with a few schedules filed as an addendum on April 5, 1991.

A month later, on April 30, 1991, Peoples Gas System, Inc. bought the assets of PBCUC. PBCUC thus no longer exists as a regulated entity, and MMFR data no longer represent either the rate base or the net operating income of the utility operation, which is now a division of Peoples Gas System, Inc. The MMFR data are no longer relevant. No further analysis of the data needs to be made or any action taken thereon, and this docket can be closed.

It is therefore

ORDERED that this Order shall become final unless an appropriate petition for formal proceeding is timely filed herein. It is further

NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.59(4), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing or judicial review of Commission orders that is available under Sections 120.57 or 120.68, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing or judicial review will be granted or result in the relief sought.

The action proposed herein is preliminary in nature and will not become effective or final, except as provided by Rule 25-22.029, Florida Administrative Code. Any person whose substantial interests are affected by the action proposed by this order may file a petition for a formal proceeding, as provided by Rule 25-22.029(4), Florida Administrative Code, in the form provided by Rule 25-22.036(7)(a) and (f), Florida Administrative Code. This petition must be received by the Director, Division of Records and Reporting at his office at 101 East Gaines Street, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0870, by the close of business on June 24, 1991

In the absence of such a petition, this order shall become effective on the day subsequent to the above date as provided by Rule 25-22.029(6), Florida Administrative Code.

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Any objection or protest filed in this docket before the issuance date of this order is considered abandoned unless it satisfies the foregoing conditions and is renewed within the specified protest period.

If this order becomes final and effective on the date described above, any party adversely affected may request judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility or by the First District Court of Appeal in the case of a water or sewer utility by filing a notice of appeal with the Director, Division of Records and Reporting and filing a copy of the notice of appeal and the filing fee with the appropriate court. This filing must be completed within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this order, pursuant to Rule 9.110, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure. The notice of appeal must be in the form specified in Rule 9.900(a), Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
