Attached for filing with the Commission are revisions to the General Services Tariff of AT&T Communications of the Southern States, Inc., to be effective September 1, 1991. Listed below are the affected pages:

In this filing AT&T is proposing to implement a zero minus ("0-") surcharge of \$.75 for certain operator assisted calls. This surcharge will apply to Operator Station and Person-to-Person calls where the customer has the capability to dial the number but elects instead to have the operator dial.

The "0-" surcharge would be in addition to the applicable service charge for the type of operator service requested. The surcharge will not apply to AT&T Calling Card calls, calls placed by an operator for individuals who are identified as being handicapped, or calls that cannot be completed due to defective equipment or technical difficulties on AT&T's network.

The purpose of the new service charge is to reduce the volume of highly labor intensive (and, hence, costly to process) "0-" calls. In addition to performing their usual call processing functions (e.g., obtaining acceptance on a collect call), when Mr. Walter D'Haeseleer August 1, 1991 Page 2

a call is dialed on a "0-" basis AT&T's operator services personnel must obtain the digits of the called number verbally from the call originator and input those digits at the operator service position to place the call through the network. Aside from the operator work time necessary to accomplish these functions, the customer-operator interaction caused by this process (e.g., misunderstanding of customer dialing instructions and redialing of the called number) contributes to further operator call handling time. Implementation of this surcharge will create an economic incentive for customers placing such calls to use less costly and more efficient "0+" dialing instead of "0-" calling.

The annual revenue impact of this filing is estimated to be \$2,171,000. The proposed revenues cover the cost of providing the service.

A1. DEFINITION OF TERMS

PREMISES (SAME)

The term "Same Premises" shall be interpreted to mean: (a) the building or buildings, together with the surrounding land occupied or used in the conduct of one establishment or business, or as a residence, and not intersected by a public thoroughfare or by property occupied by others; or (b) the portion of the building occupied by the subscriber, either in the conduct of his business or as a residence, and not intersected by a public corridor or by space occupied by others; or (c) the building or portion of a building occupied by the subscriber in the conduct of his business and as a residence provided both the business and the residence bear the same street address; or (d) the continuous property operated as a single farm whether or not intersected by a public thoroughfare.

PROTECTIVE CIRCUITRY

Protective circuitry is one or both of the following: A Company-provided connecting arrangement or discrete electrical circuitry that is within the scope of the Registration Program and is designed to protect service provided by the Company from harm.

REAL TIME RATED - OPERATOR STATION/PERSON-TO-PERSON

See "Message Telecommunications Service".

SERVICE CHARGES AND SURCHARGES

A Service charge is applicable to Customer Dialed Calling Card Station, Operator Station, Person-to-Person and Real Time Rated calls and for Busy Line Verification and Busy Line Interruptions. This charge is in addition to the initial minute and additional minute charges applicable to a call.

A surcharge applies to Operator Station and Person-to-Person calls (as specified in Section All.3.1.I.6 following) in which the customer has the capability to dial the number, but has the operator dial instead. (N)

SUBSCRIBER/CUSTOMER

Any person, firm, partnership, corporation, municipality, cooperative organization or governmental agency furnished communication service by the Company under the provisions and regulations of its Tariff.

TELECOMPUNICATIONS SERVICES

The various services offered by the Company as specified in this General Services Tariff.

TELEPHONE NUMBER

A designation assigned by the local exchange carrier to a telephone service for convenience in operating.

Operator Station rates apply to station-to-station telephone (C) communication where the completion of the call or a request for any information or assistance relating to billing or charges for such call requires the assistance of an operator, except for operator services used in connection with dial type telephone communication as noted preceding. Operator Station calls include station-to-station calls placed from a public or semipublic coin telephone. (C)

Operator Dialed Surcharge - A surcharge applies to Operator (N) Station Calls in which the customer has the capacity to dial the number, but has the operator dial instead as provided for in section All.3.1.I.6. The surcharge does not apply to:

- Calls where a Customer cannot otherwise dial the call, due to defective equipment or trouble on the AT&T Telecommunications Networks,
- b. Calls in which a Company operator places a call for a calling party who is identified as being handicapped and unable to dial the call because of his/her handicap,
