Dear Mr. Tribble:

By this letter, we ask for approval of a historical test year ending December 31, 1991 for a rate case (MFRs) to be filed on behalf of Southern States Utilities, Inc., Deltona Utilities, Inc. and United Florida Utilities Corporation within ninety (90) days of approval of this test year letter. Southern States Utilities, Inc. ("Southern States") expects to complete the consolidation of these utilities and their subsidiaries prior to approval of the MFRs in this proceeding. As a result of the consolidation, the utilities will operate under the name of Southern States Utilities, Inc. Accordingly, the utilities will be referred to collectively in this letter as Southern States or the "Company."

The rate case will include all of Southern States' Commission-regulated water and wastewater systems with the exception of the Marco Island water and wastewater systems. The 127 systems to be included in this proceeding and the counties in which they are

^{&#}x27;Southern States' newest affiliate, Lehigh Utilities, Inc. ("Lehigh"), operates a water and wastewater system in Lee County which is subject to the Commission's jurisdiction. Lehigh has received Commission approval to file a separate rate case in Docket No. 911188-WS. Lehigh will not be consolidated into Southern States in the near future.

located are identified in Appendix A hereto. One hundred percent (100%) of the stock of Southern States is owned by Topeka Group Incorporated. Thus, Topeka Group Incorporated has ultimate ownership and operational control of Southern States.

Major plant improvements, expansions and refurbishments which have been placed in service between January 1, 1990 and December 31, 1991 (the end of the requested test year) which Southern States seeks to have included in rate base are identified in Appendix B which is attached hereto. Southern States also seeks to recover a return on plant improvements, expansions and refurbishments made prior to January 1, 1990 and normal additions of transmission, distribution and collection mains and lines as well as increases in operations and maintenance expenses associated with all of the expansions, improvements, refurbishments and additions which have occurred on each system since rates were last determined by the Commission.

Also, please be advised that Southern States Utility Services, Inc. (SSUSI) will be consolidated into Southern States. The administrative and general expenses of Southern States will include all of SSUSI's former administrative and general expenses as well as the administrative and general expenses of Lehigh. A portion of the combined administrative and general expenses will be allocated to each of the systems in this proceeding.

Southern States seeks approval of the use of a historical test year rather than a projected test year due to the magnitude of the information which must be presented by the Company and considered by the Commission in this proceeding. All of the plant expansions, improvements, refurbishments and additions to be included in this proceeding have been placed in service as of December 31, 1991. The operations and maintenance expenses, administrative and general expenses, taxes, regulatory assessment fees and other expenses to be included in this proceeding are Southern States' actual costs from the historical 1991 fiscal and test year. For these reasons, the historical test year ended December 31, 1991 is representative of current utility operations.

Southern States intends to utilize a beginning and year end simple average rate base as currently required by Commission Form PSC/WAS 17 (entitled "Financial, Rate and Engineering Minimum Filing Requirements - Class A and B Utilities," which is incorporated into Rule 25-30.437, Florida Administrative Code, by reference). Southern States intends to utilize the one-eighth (1/8) formula method of determining the working capital allowance, as also required by Form PSC/WAS 17. Southern States further intends to determine the Company's cost of equity by utilizing the Commission's leverage formula.

Southern States also intends to make appropriate pro forma adjustments to final rates relating to an additional annual expense of approximately \$1.4 million to satisfy obligations to be incurred as of January 1, 1993 regarding the funding of post-retirement benefits, as required by FASB 206. The \$1.4 million liability is based on an actuarial study of Southern States' 460 existing and retired employees as adjusted to include estimated additional obligations relating to Lehigh employees.

Southern States requests authority to file testimony and exhibits in support of the MFRs within thirty (30) days after Commission acceptance of the MFRs.

Finally, Southern States requests that the full Commission be assigned to consider its request for rate relief in this proceeding due to the consolidation of Southern States Utilities, Inc. with Southern States Utility Services, Inc., Deltona Utilities, Inc., United Florida Utilities Corp., et al., the potential complexity of the issues related to such consolidation and its effect on the Commission's consideration of the merits of Southern States' application.

Thank you for your consideration of the requests made in this letter.
