SOUTHERN BELL TELEPHONE AND TELEGRAPH COMPANY'S MOTION FOR SECOND EXTENSION OF TIME

COMES NOW BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc., d/b/a
Southern Bell Telephone and Telegraph Company ("Southern Bell" or
"Company"), pursuant to Rule 25-22.037, Florida Administrative
Code, hereby moves the Florida Public Service Commission ("the
Commission") for an additional thirty-day extension of time in
which to respond to Order No. 25675 in the above-referenced
docket, and as grounds therefore states:

- 1. On February 3, 1992, the Commission issued Order No. 25675 requiring Southern Bell to file traffic studies. The Order requires that Southern Bell extract data for fifty-nine (59) routes. Because of the large number of routes involved, the data processing is significantly more complicated then for traffic studies of more limited scope. Therefore, Southern Bell moved for a thirty-day extension, until May 4, 1992, to respond to Order No. 25675. This extension was granted on March 23, 1992, by Order No. PSC-92-0085-PCO-TL.
- 2. Subsequent to the granting of the extension described above, systematic difficulties have arisen that will cause a further unanticipated delay in the filing of these traffic studies. Specifically, in October of 1991, Southern Bell's Data Processing Center in Jacksonville, Florida, (at which the traffic

studies in question would have been run) was consolidated with several other processing centers to form a Regional Data Center in Miami, Florida. This consolidation, which will result in long term efficiencies for Southern Bell and its ratepayers, involved changes in both the personnel responsible for processing the pertinent data as well as systematic changes in the manner in which these data are processed.

- 3. In April of this year, Southern Bell undertook the first traffic studies to be processed at this new Regional Center. The first two traffic studies, which were processed in the month of April as ordered in Docket Nos. 911186-TL and 911184-TL, required substantially longer to complete than usual because of the changes in personnel and procedure attendant to the consolidation of data centers. The complexity of the studies required in this docket, combined with the factors set forth above, have caused even greater delay in the processing of the necessary data to complete the instant studies. Southern Bell anticipates that the delays that have occurred in April represent only short term problems that have been resolved.
- 4. The traffic studies in question may be completed in as little as one additional week. In an abundance of caution, however, and to ensure that no further extension will be needed, Southern Bell has herein requested an extension of thirty days. If, in fact, this entire thirty-day period is not needed to complete the traffic studies, then Southern Bell will file the

studies at the earliest time within the thirty-day period at which complete and accurate studies can be finalized.

5. The requested extension will not prejudice any party to this proceeding and will facilitate a reasoned, informed decision by this Commission. It is also anticipated that the problems that gave rise to the need for this extension will not recur.

WHEREFORE, Southern Bell Telephone and Telegraph Company respectfully requests that the Commission grant it an additional thirty-day extension, until June 4, 1992, in which to respond to Order No. 25675.
