Persons, other than the original parties to a pending proceeding, who have a substantial interest in the proceeding, and who desire to become parties may petition the presiding officer for leave to intervene. Petition for leave to intervene must be filed at leave five (5) days before the final hearing, must conform with Commission Rule 25-22.036(7)(a), and must include allegations sufficient to demonstrate that the intervenor is entitled to participate in the proceeding as a matter of constitutional or statutory right or pursuant to Commission rule, or that the substantial interests of the intervenor are subject to determination or will be affected through the proceeding. Intervenors take the case as they find it.

The notice of hearing shall contain the statements set out in Section 120.57(1)(b)2,. F.S. No less than seven (7) days notice shall be given for all other hearings.

(1) The provisions of this rule shall apply to all public hearings conducted by the Commission, except rulemaking hearings held pursuant to 25-22.010 through .018, F.A.C.

(2) Notice of such public hearings shall be given by the Commission to the clerk of the board of county commissioners of each county affected, the chief executive officer of each municipality in the area affected, all parties of record and all persons who have requested notice of such proceedings.

(3) A summary of the subject matter and notice of hearing shall be published by the Commission in the Florida Administrative Weekly. The summary shall be drawn and notice given as required by the provisions of the statute under which relief is sought, if applicable, but shall not be published less than 14 days prior to the hearing.

(4) The Commission may require any public utility in such proceedings to publish additional notices in newspapers of general circulation in the area affected and to give notice to its customers by mail, as may be deemed reasonably necessary by the Commission to afford adequate notice to the customers of the utility.
