First of all, in the way of introductions, my

name is Terry Deason, I'm Chairman of the Public
Service Commission; and to my left is Commissioner
Julia Johnson. This evening, Commissioners Susan Clark
and Luis Lauredo are having a public hearing on this
same matter in Jacksonville.

There are a number of Staff persons here this evening for any questions that customers may have. I see standing in the back is Ms. Brenda Monroe. Brenda, if you will raise your hand. And if you have any questions, I'm sure she will be glad to help you.

The purpose of the hearing this evening is to hear from the customers regarding the dockets which have just been described by Mr. Pierson. There has been a special report prepared by the Public Service Commission, it's printed on blue paper. It describes the proceedings; and attached to the back of this report is a sheet which may be detached and gives customers an opportunity to mail in comments to the Public Service Commission. This may be done in lieu of giving an oral presentation to the Commission this evening.

The procedure we're going to follow this evening is I want to have brief opening statements by Southern Bell and by the Public Counsel's office, after which witnesses will be sworn in. And as your name is

18	MS. WHITE: With me is Mr. Cort Lantaff, who

21	MR. LANTAFF: Good evening. I'm Cort Lantaf	
22	and I'm an assistant vice president of Southern Bell in	
23	Florida.	
24	I'm going to be very brief tonight so we can	
25	get to your views. However, there are a few things I	

believe need to be said to set the context for tonight's discussion. We need to look no further than the headlines of recent newspapers and news magazine articles to realize that the telephone business is changing at an ever-increasing pace.

Time Magazine recently described the historic merger of Bell Atlantic, one of the regional Bell companies, and TCI, the nation's largest cable television company, in these terms, and I quote: "By adding high speed switches to the cable wires that serve TCI's almost 11 million customers, Bell Atlantic would enable its subscribers to choose from hundreds of channels with the flick of a remote control button.

Bell Atlantic could also provide phone service, even video phone service, over TCI's cable wires and thereby invade the territories of other Baby Bells from coast to coast."

And a recent front page article in a major

Florida newspaper said, and I quote: "In Florida, the

merger of Bell Atlantic and TCI may challenge Southern

Bell's decades-old dominance of local telephone

service," end quote. The story continued that by mid
1994, the Bell Atlantic TCI system will link living

rooms in major portions of Florida with America's data

super highway through a single outlet in the home.

Yes, America and Florida in particular are in the middle of a communications revolution, not an evolution. And yet our traditional regulatory process never envisioned this changing market. The regulatory policies of the past do not address the changes that are occurring today, let along tomorrow's changes.

That brings me to the proposal we have before the Public Service Commission. That proposal is really about continuing Florida's tradition -- transition to this new world. It's about providing you options. It's about providing reasonably priced, reliable service and yes, about positioning Southern Bell to be able to compete in this new world of competition.

Since we have already sent our customers a bill insert that describes our proposals in detail and the Commission has provided information tonight as well, I will not belabor these points tonight. If you still have questions, we have some Southern Bell employees here who can explain more to you individually. However, I do want to emphasize two primary points about our proposal.

First, this is a rate reduction case. Since 1988, when the PSC approved Southern Bell's current incentive regulatory plan, you, our customers, have received more than \$1.4 billion in rate reductions and

refunds. In our proposal that we're talking about
tonight, we're suggesting another reduction of over 26
million to you, in addition to the 49 million in
reductions already scheduled.

And secondly, if Southern Bell is to be able to continue offering reasonably priced service, we must have a regulatory environment that encourages efficiency and provides the capital resources so that we can bring the benefits of the information age to you.

There are many other beneficial features of our proposal, but I promised to be brief. Tonight is about hearing from you.

Thank you, and I look forward to hearing your comments.

MR. HOWE: My name is Roger Howe. I work in Tallahassee for a gentleman named Jack Shreve. Jack is the Public Counsel for the State of Florida. He's charged by statute to represent the consumers in matters related to the jurisdiction of the Public Service Commission. In that regard in this case, Jack and our office represent the customers of Southern Bell.

It's our job to provide the adversarial

FLORIDA PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION

nature to the proceeding; whereas on the one hand you'll have the Company representing its best interests, it's our job to represent the interests of the customers. And in trying to fulfill that obligation, our office has devoted a lot of resources to this case. Today, we filed the testimony of, I believe, half a dozen witnesses, three analysts in our office and three outside consultants that we hired to analyze the Company's data and to see exactly where the Company should be, how the customer should be treated, to on the one hand, give the Company an opportunity to earn a fair profit, but on the other hand, give the customers the service and the rates that they deserve.

In that regard, we think \$26 million as a proposed rate reduction is grossly insignificant. We think the rate reduction should be on the order of several hundred million dollars. And these are dollars that we think should be returned to the customers.

We do not disagree that times are changing and that the Information Age is well upon us. But we believe there have been economies of scale, new technology that will enable the Utility to provide service at a lower cost.

We think that the purpose of this proceeding should be twofold: To reduce rates is one. And that's

to reduce rates to the appropriate level so you, the customers, only pay a fair amount; and secondly, to see to it that the Utility's service is improved.

One of the dockets that was read to you in the notice is an investigation into the integrity of Southern Bell's repair service activities and reports. This case is going to look at the quality of service this Company has been providing to its customers. We think the Company should be sanctioned for past improprieties, and that in the future this Company needs more regulatory oversight than it has in the past.

So if anybody would like to speak to this Commission, I'd ask that they come forward and we'd be interested in hearing what you have to say about the rates you pay, about the service you receive, and about what you expect from your telephone utility.

Thank you.

CHAIRMAN DEASON: Thank you. At this time if there are any individuals from the public who wish to testify, it would be necessary for you to stand and to raise your right hand and to be sworn in so that you can give your testimony. If there are any witnesses present, would you please stand and raise your right hand?

Let the record reflect that there are no individuals from the public who wish to testify at this time.

What we're going to do is take an informal

what we're going to do is take an informal recess until 6:30, in anticipation that some witnesses may come in during that time. We'll reconvene at 6:30; and if there are no other witnesses present at that time, we will adjourn the hearing. At this time, we're in informal recess until 6:30.

MR. HOWE: I don't believe so, Chairman Deason.

Let the record reflect that there are no individuals from the public indicating that they wish to testify.
