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## ORDER INDICATING EXEMPT STATUS OF LAMPLIGHTER MOBILE HOME PARK AND CLOSING DOCKET

## BY THE COMMISSION:

On June 9, 1994, Lamplighter Mobile Home Park (Lamplighter) filed an application with this Commission for recognition of its exempt status pursuant to Section 367.022(5) and (8), Florida Statutes, for water and wastewater service, respectively. Lamplighter is a 455-unit mobile home community located at 9101 West Normandy Boulevard, Jacksonville, Florida. Lamplighter provides water service; wastewater service is purchased from the City of Jacksonville. Mr. Carl R. Peterson, Jr., Attorney, Parker, Skelding, Labasky & Corry, and primary contact person, filed the application on behalf of Lamplighter. Mr. Peterson's address is 318 North Monroe Street, Tallahassee, Florida 32302.

Upon request and sufficient proof, the Commission will issue an order indicating the nonjurisdictional or exempt status of water and wastewater facilities, if they qualify under the appropriate provision of Chapter 367, Florida Statutes. The application was filed in accordance with Section 367.022(5) and (8), Florida Statutes. Section 367.022(5), Florida Statutes, states that an entity qualifies for exemption from Commission regulation if it provides service solely to its tenants, and there are no specific charges for the utility service. Lamplighter's application indicates that it provides water service only to its tenants and the service territory is limited to the mobile home park at 9101 West Normandy Boulevard, Jacksonville, Florida. Also, the water service is included as a nonspecific portion of the monthly rent.

Section 367.022(8), Florida Statutes, states, in part, that "[a]ny person who resells water or wastewater service at a rate or charge which does not exceed the actual purchase price thereof," and who complies with certain reporting requirements, is exempt from Commission regulation. According to Lamplighter's application, wastewater service is purchased from the City of Jacksonville; wastewater service is provided at a charge that does not exceed the actual purchase price; Lamplighter is aware of the

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requirements of Rule 25-30.111, Florida Administrative Code; and the service area is limited to the mobile home park.

In addition, pursuant to Section 837.06, Florida Statutes, and Rule 25-30.060(2)(f), Florida Administrative Code, anyone knowingly making a false statement in writing with the intent to mislead is guilty of a misdemeanor. By signing the application, Mr. Peterson acknowledged that he is aware of Section 837.06, Florida Statutes, and the penalties for making false statements in the application.

Based upon the facts as represented, we find that Lamplighter is exempt from Commission regulation, pursuant to the provisions of Section 367.022(5) and (8), Florida Statutes, for water and wastewater service, respectively. However, should there be any change in circumstances or method of operation of the water and/or wastewater systems, the owner of Lamplighter or any successor in interest must inform the Commission within 30 days of such change so that its exempt status may be reevaluated.

It is, therefore,

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that, based upon the facts as represented, Lamplighter Mobile Home Park, 9101 Normandy Boulevard, Jacksonville, Florida 32221, is exempt from Commission regulation, pursuant to the provisions of Section 367.022(5) and (8), Florida Statutes, for water and wastewater service, respectively. It is further

ORDERED that should there be any change in circumstances or method of operation, the owner of Lamplighter Mobile Home Park or any successors in interest, shall inform this Commission within 30 days of such a change so that we may reevaluate its exempt status. It is further

ORDERED that this docket is hereby closed.

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## NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.59(4), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing or judicial review of Commission orders that is available under Sections 120.57 or 120.68, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing or judicial review will be granted or result in the relief sought.

Any party adversely affected by the Commission's final action in this matter may request: 1) reconsideration of the decision by filing a motion for reconsideration with the Director, Division of Records and Reporting within fifteen (15) days of the issuance of this order in the form prescribed by Rule 25-22.060, Florida Administrative Code; or 2) judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility or the First District Court of Appeal in the case of a water and/or wastewater utility by filing a notice of appeal with the Director, Division of Records and Reporting and filing a copy of the notice of appeal and the filing fee with the appropriate court. This filing must be completed within thirty (30) days after the issuance of this order, pursuant to Rule 9.110, Florida Rules of Civil Procedure. The notice of appeal must be in the form specified in Rule 9.900 (a), Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
