

**STAFF RECOMMENDATION:** If the Commission approves Issue 1, the official filing date should be the date that all of the information is submitted and deemed by Staff to be complete. If the Commission denies Staff's recommendation in Issue 1, the official filing date should be July 17, 1995. (O'SULLIVAN, WILLIS)

**<u>STAFF ANALYSIS</u>**. If the Commission approves Issue 1, the official filing date would therefore be established as the date that this information is completed.

If the Commission finds that SSU does not need to request rate relief for Hernando, Hillsborough, and Polk Counties in its filing for uniform rates, then the official filing date should be established as July 17, 1995. However, SSU should, as it has proposed to do, provide the Commission with the information regarding those counties which may be necessary to the rate proceeding.
