TCG'S STATUS REPORT

Teleport Communications Group Inc./TCG South Florida ("TCG"), pursuant to the requirement set forth in Order No. PSC-95-1300-PCO-TP issued by the Prehearing Officer on October 20, 1995, hereby files its Status Report concerning the need for a final hearing on TCG's Petition to Establish Economically Viable, Nondiscriminatory Mutual Compensation Rates for the Exchange of Telephone Traffic between TCG and BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. ("BellSouth"), and states as follows:

- 1. On August 31, 1995, TCG filed a Petition to Establish Economically Viable, Nondiscriminatory Mutual Compensation Rates for the Exchange of Telephone Traffic between TCG and BellSouth. The Petition was filed pursuant to Section 364.162(2), Florida Statutes (1995), after TCG and BellSouth were unable to successfully negotiate mutually acceptable prices, terms and conditions of interconnection for the exchange of telephone traffic.
- 2. The final hearing on TCG's Petition was scheduled for October 23-28, 1995. However, on October 17, 1995, TCG and BellSouth executed a Stipulation and Agreement proposing to resolve not only the issues in the above-captioned docket, but the issues DOCUMERT NUMBER-DATE

raised in Docket Nos. 950696-TP (interim universal service/carrier-of-last-resort recovery mechanism), 950737-TP (temporary telephone number portability solution) and 950984-TP (unbundling and resale of local exchange telecommunications company network features, functions and capabilities). The effectiveness of the Stipulation and Agreement was contingent on the Commission's approval of BellSouth's proposed interim universal service/carrier-of-last-resort recovery mechanism - Alternative 1, as modified by the Stipulation and Agreement.

- Agreement between TCG and BellSouth and the above contingency for the effectiveness thereof, TCG and BellSouth filed a Joint Motion for Stay of the above-captioned proceeding on October 17, 1995. The purpose of the Joint Motion for Stay was to provide for a temporary stay of the above-captioned proceeding in the event a final hearing proved unnecessary should the Commission approve BellSouth's proposed Alternative 1, as modified by said Stipulation and Agreement, in Docket No. 950696-TP. As a part of the Joint Motion for Stay of Proceeding, TCG and BellSouth advised that it would file a status report with the Commission on or before December 15, 1995, indicating whether a final hearing in the above-captioned docket would be necessary.
- 4. Yesterday, December 14, 1995, the Commission voted on the Staff Recommendation in Docket No. 950696-TP. The Commission did not approve BellSouth's proposed Alternative 1, as modified by the above-said Stipulation and Agreement. Page 8 of the Stipulation

and Agreement governs the actions to be taken by the parties in such event and states, in pertinent part:

[I]f BellSouth's proposed Alternative 1, as modified by this Stipulation and Agreement ... is not adopted by the Commission ... the parties recognize that the interconnection arrangements agreed to herein are not appropriate and are null and void. In the parties will begin to event, negotiate different local interconnection arrangements as expeditiously as possible. These negotiations should include some interim arrangements that could become effective on January 1, 1996, while further negotiations or if necessary, Commission proceedings, The parties stipulate and agree continue. terms, conditions the and prices ultimately ordered by the Commission, or negotiated by the parties, will be effective retroactive to January 1, 1996. (Emphasis supplied.)

5. On December 13, 1995, TCG executed and joined a Second Stipulation and Agreement entered into and filed with the Commission on December 8, 1995 by BellSouth, Florida Cable Telecommunications Association, Inc., Continental Cablevision, Inc. and Time Warner AxS/Digital Media Partners. This Second Stipulation also proposes to resolve any and all issues raised in Docket Nos. 950696-TP, 950737-TP, 950984-TP and 950985-TP (and the sub-dockets opened therein). However, the effectiveness of the Second Stipulation and Agreement is predicated on Commission approval as reflected in the provision on page 16 of said agreement:

The undersigned parties further agree that, in the event the Commission does not adopt this Stipulation and Agreement in its entirety, the Stipulation and Agreement shall not be binding upon the parties.

6. A final hearing in the above-captioned docket on TCG's Petition as well as similar petitions filed by Continental Cablevision, Inc., Time Warner AxS, LP./Digital Media Partners, MCI Metro Access Transmission Services, Inc. and Metropolitan Fiber Systems of Florida, Inc. is currently scheduled for hearing on January 10-13, 1996. In light of the facts set forth in this Status Report, TCG advises the Commission that a final hearing remains necessary as scheduled unless and until the Commission approves the above-described Second Stipulation and Agreement. Whether interconnection rates are set by the Commission or are established pursuant to the Second Stipulation and Agreement (if approved by the Commission), such rates will be retroactively applied to any exchange of telephone traffic between TCG and BellSouth effective January 1, 1996.
