## CONTINENTAL'S RESPONSE TO MOTIONS FOR RECONSIDERATION

Pursuant to Rule 25-22.060, Florida Administrative Code,
Continental Cablevision, Inc., on behalf of its affiliates,
Continental Fiber Technologies, Inc. d/b/a AlterNet and
Continental Florida Telecommunications, Inc. (collectively
"Continental"), respectfully submits the following Response to
Motions for Reconsideration filed in the above-captioned docket
by BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. ("BellSouth"), the Florida
Cable Telecommunications Association, Inc. ("FCTA"), and Time
Warner AXS of Florida, L.P. and Digital Media Partners ("Time
Warner").

Unlike BellSouth, FCTA and Time Warner, Continental is not seeking reconsideration of Order No. PSC-96-0445-FOF-TP, issued March 29, 1996 ("the Order"). Continental does not necessarily

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believe that the Commission should reconsider the Order. Rather, Continental is filing this Response solely for the purpose of seeking the Commission's clarification of the Order.

Continental is sympathetic to the views expressed in the motions for reconsideration filed by FCTA and Time Warner with regard to apparent discrimination in interconnection rates, terms and conditions. If FCTA and Time Warner's interpretation of the Commission's intent with respect to the tariff that BellSouth has been ordered to file is accurate, then reconsideration is the proper remedy. However, Continental believes that, if its interpretation is correct, mere clarification by the Commission will resolve the concerns of Continental and may be sufficient to also resolve the issues raised by FCTA and Time Warner.

At Page 16 of the Order, the Commission discusses its decision regarding Issue No. 2 which deals with whether BellSouth should tariff the interconnection rates, terms and conditions established by the Commission in resolving petitions filed by Metropolitan Fiber Systems of Florida, Inc. ("MFS") and MCI Metro Access Transmission Services, Inc. ("MCI"). The Order notes agreement between the parties that BellSouth should file such a tariff and, at Page 40, orders BellSouth to take such action.

The Commission finds "that these interconnection rates and other arrangements shall be available to all similarly situated ALECs on a non-discriminatory basis." Order at 16. Then the Commission states:

Tariffing the interconnection rates makes these rates generally available. If a company believes that its situation is different from the other ALECs' in this proceeding, it may negotiate its own rates, terms, and conditions with BellSouth.

Id. In Continental's view, the above-quoted language, without further explanation, appears to have opened the door to different interpretations by the parties of their rights and obligations under the tariff that BellSouth will file.

FCTA and Time Warner appear to interpret this language as disqualifying those parties who are signatories to the Stipulation and Agreement with BellSouth from electing to order interconnection arrangements under the forth-coming tariff. If this is a correct interpretation, FCTA and Time Warner are right in asserting that the Commission has violated the statutory proscription on setting discriminatory rates, terms and conditions found in Chapter 364, Florida Statutes.

Such discrimination would arise by the Commission's approval of a minute-of-use rate with a cap for parties entering into the Stipulation and Agreement and later establishment of mutual traffic exchange for parties who did not enter into the Stipulation and Agreement. If FCTA and Time Warner's interpretation of the Commission's tariffing requirement imposed on BellSouth is correct, then Continental agrees that the Commission's action is discriminatory and reconsideration is necessary to bring the Commission's decision into compliance with Chapter 364, Florida Statutes.

Continental's interpretation is that the Commission intends for all ALECs, notwithstanding whether they have entered into the Stipulation and Agreement, to have the right to order interconnection arrangements under the forth-coming tariff at the rates, terms and conditions established in resolution of MFS and MCI's petitions. If Continental's interpretation is an accurate reading of the Commission's intent, then mere clarification on this point will resolve Continental's concerns and may also resolve the issues raised in FCTA and Time Warner's motions for reconsideration.

Continental urges the Commission to clarify the Order by ordering that the tariff governing interconnection arrangements

to be filed by BellSouth shall be available to all ALECs, including those who have entered into the Stipulation and Agreement with BellSouth.
