23		not encompass such things as cable vaults, equipment rooms or
24		telephone closets, as Sprint's pathway theory would.

2		argument, concluding that such an "overly broad" interpretation could
3		harm owners and managers of small buildings, as well as ILECs, "by
4		requiring additional resources to effectively control and monitor such
5		rights-of-way located on their properties." (Order, ¶ 1185.)
