

Dear Ms. Bayo:

The Federation of Mobile Home Owners of Florida, Inc. wishes to provide comments to the staff of the Florida Public Service Commission regarding the issues that were discussed at the workshop held on February 23, 1996 regarding reseller exemptions. The Federation of Mobile Home Owners of Florida, Inc., known as the FMO, was represented at that workshop by Attorney David L. Swafford, of Pennington, Culpepper, Moore, Wilkinson, Dunbar, & Dunlap, P.A. He has advised the FMO that we have the opportunity to provide written comments to the Public Service Commission staff regarding the issues discussed at the workshop.

The Federation of Mobile Home Owners of Florida, Inc. is a statewide, consumer advocacy association, which is dedicated to protecting the rights and interests and enriching the lifestyle of mobile home owners throughout the State of Florida. The FMO was first formed in 1962 and has a membership at this time of approximately 220,000 mobile home owners representing some 110,000 mobile homes in the State of Florida. The FMO and its membership was instrumental in the passage of Florida Statutes Chapter 723 which deals with mobile home park tenancies. The overwhelming majority of FMO members are retirees, most of whom live on a fixed income and have chosen a mobile home as their retirement home because of the lifestyle that is provided in a mobile home community and because this type of home is an affordable one.

I. Reseller Methodology

Requirement for Installation of Meters

Most rental mobile home parks do not have individual meters to each home. The newly developed rental mobile home parks, as well as resident owned communities such as mobile home subdivisions, usually have individual metering; however, this type of community represents only 10 to 15% of mobile homes throughout the state. Most of the development of mobile home communities in recent years has been as a subdivision, and thus, the newer mobile home parks are being individually metered.

The issues that the PSC staff discussed in the workshop are being addressed in new mobile home developments.

Mobile home parks presently in existence should be exempted from any law or rule requiring individual metering because of the significant economic impact that such a rule or law would have upon existing mobile home owners. Florida Statutes Chapter 723 requires that all park owners provide prospective mobile home owners with a document known as a prospectus. This document must disclose information regarding the manner in which utility and other services are furnished, together with the lot rental amount that is charged by the park owner for such services. Charges that are not disclosed may not be collected by the park owner.

The prospectus is a bilateral agreement between the park owner and mobile home owner. If a law or rule was passed with retroactive effect requiring the installation of meters, the contract rights of each and every mobile home owner would be adversely affected. As stated before, in most cases there is not individual metering in rental mobile home parks and water is provided as a portion of the base rent. When water service in a mobile home park is changed from a master meter which is paid in the base rent on a pro rata basis by each and every mobile home owner in the park to individual metering, the water bills for these residents usually double and sometimes triple because of the base facility charges, together with minimum usage charges.

Past experience has shown that when hook up to individual meters has been required because of some deficiency in the park owner's individually owned water system, the reduction in rent given by the park owner is never equal to the bills that the residents are forced to pay under the new individual metering system. The park owner is usually able to provide water to the residents for a nominal amount such as \$10 which is included in the rent, but when individual metering is required, the bills jump to \$20 to \$30. The park owner gives only a \$10 credit on their rent (his cost of providing the water) and the mobile home owners are forced to pay the larger sums. For many persons \$20 or \$30 additional dollars per month for the minimum use of the water, is an extreme hardship because of their fixed income situation.

2. The agenda cited several issues as to how the water usage should be allocated.

As stated above, most rental mobile home parks in Florida do not have individual metering, and the residents pay for water based on a pro rata basis and the amount is included in their rent. For those residents who are presently in such a situation, we believe that the only fair and equitable means of allocating water usage to them is to

permit existing mobile home parls to continue proving water in the same manner as they presently are doing. This would not violate existing mobile home owners' contract rights. All new construction of mobile home parks, whether it be resident owned such as a subdivision, or a new rental mobile home park could be required to have individual metering. This would be disclosed to prospective purchasers in subdivisions prior to the time that they enter into an purchase agreement and would be disclosed to prospective mobile home owners in their prospectus if they were moving into a rental park. This would permit prospective mobile home owners to make an informed business decision. To impose any allocation other than that which is presently found in the currently developed mobile home parks would seriously impinge upon the established contract rights between mobile home owners and mobile home park owners.

3. Customer Deposits, Miscellaneous Charges, and Discontinuance of Service.

Very few mobile home parks have deposits specifically for utilities because utilities are ordinarily part of the base rent that is paid by tenants in the rental mobile home park.

II. Need for Statutory Changes

Regulatory Statute for Resellers

Florida Statutes Chapter 723 already has a provision for mobile home park owners who resell utilities. Florida Statue 723.045, prohibits a mobile home park owner or developer who purchases water from a water system for the purpose of supplying or reselling to his tenants' from charging, either directly or indirectly, any amount greater than that charged by the utility from which the water is purchased, except that the park owner is permitted to charge for maintenance actually incurred and administrative costs. Thus, this issue has already been covered by the Legislature as to reseller of water in mobile home parks.

Conservation Incentive for Recovery of Meter Installation and Expenses and for Recovery of Maintenance and Operating Expenses over Purchased Water and Waste Water.

The overwhelming majority of mobile home parks in Florida are occupied by retirees, although there are some family park in certain areas of the state. Statistics show that mobile home occupants do not use as much water as do the occupants of standard residential living units. The record in a case presently pending before the First District Court Appeal, No. 95-03205, filed by the residents of mobile home

parks being serviced by the North Fort Myers Utility Inc., supports this statement. North Fort Myers Utility admits that mobile home owners used 200 gallons per day which is less than the 275 gallons per day for standard residential usage. However, the evidence presented by the expert for the mobile home owners in that case shows that the average daily use for mobile homes based upon actual historical data is only 100 gallons per day. Even the peak month usage was only 140 gallons per day for mobile homes. Thus, it is apparent that mobile home owners already conserve water and use less than one-half of the amount of water that a standard residential user consumes.

III. Requirement for all dwellings to be individually metered.

The FMO strongly objects to existing mobile home parks being required to install individual meters and charging tenants for individual usage because of the detrimental effect that this action would have upon mobile home owners and their previously established contracts with mobile home park owners pursuant to the prospectus law in Chapter 723. To require retroactive installation of individual meters would have an adverse economic impact upon mobile home owners because of the significantly increased costs that they would incur in their monthly cost of living. In addition, because certain sections of Chapter 723 which permit park owners to pass through governmentally mandated capital improvements, mobile home owners could be forced to pay for installation, hook-up and impact fees for retrofitting a developed park. The Federation of Mobile Home Owners of Florida, Inc. has no objection to a requirement that newly constructed rental mobile home parks and resident owned parks such as subdivisions be individually metered.

Chapter 723.004 preempts to the Legislature all regulation and control of mobile home lot rents in mobile home parks, as well as in all other matters and things relating to the landlord-tenant relationship. This is because the Legislature has recognized the unique relationship between the mobile home owner and the mobile home park owner. When a mobile home owner purchases a home, they make a substantial investment. Once they have moved into the park, the homes are, for all effective purposes, no longer mobile and a home owner cannot remove their home without substantial expense being incurred. It is because of this hybrid tenancy that the Legislature saw fit to protect mobile home owners with the disclosure document known as the prospectus. To require retroactive installation of individual meters will violate the prospectus rights and contracts of hundreds of thousands of mobile home owners in the state, who moved into the mobile home park based upon the disclosures in their prospectus.

The Federation of Mobile Home Owners of Florida, Inc. urges the staff of the Public Service Commission to consider the comments of this organization which represents so many mobile home owners in the State of Florida. We will be happy to provide you with any further information that you require regarding the issues that the staff is addressing and the significant impact that they will have upon mobile home owners. Please keep us advised of any further workshops that may be scheduled to address this very important issue.
