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PROCEEDINGS 1 (Hearing convened at 9:30 a.m.) 2 COMMISSIONER DEASON: If I can have 3 everyone's attention, please, we'll go ahead and call 4 the prehearing conference order. I would note for the 5 record that due to the heavy fog, that some 6 participants are going to be a little bit late in 7 their arrival. I think they are just arriving. 8 We will go ahead and begin. Given that all 9 the parties, I believe, are here at this time, is 10 there any preference to which docket we take first? 11 12 Staff? MS. JOHNSON: Staff would like to proceed 13 with the 07 docket first -- it only involves one 14 party -- and probably dispose of that rather quickly. 15 COMMISSIONER DEASON: Okay. Well, let's go 16 ahead and have the notice read, please. 17 MS. JOHNSON: By notice issued January 13, 18 1997, a prehearing conference was set in Docket 19 No. 970001-EI, Fuel and Purchase Power Cost Recovery 20 Clause and Generating Performance Incentive Factor, 21 Docket No. 970002-EG, Conservation Cost Recovery 22 Clause, Docket No. 970003-GU, Purchased Gas 23 Adjustment, and Docket No. 970007-EI, Environmental 24 Cost Recovery Clause. 25

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COMMISSIONER DEASON: Thank you. We'll go 1 ahead and take appearances for all of the docket 2 3 today. MR. CHILDS: Commissioner, my name is 4 Matthew Childs with the firm of Steel, Hector and 5 Davis, appearing on behalf of Florida Power & Light 6 7 Company. MR. BERSLEY: Commissioner, I'm James D. 8 Beasley appearing with Lee L. Willis, both of the firm 9 of Ausley & McMullen appearing on behalf of Tampa 10 Electric Company in the 01, 02 and 07 dockets. 11 MR. PALECHI: Michael Palecki, City Gas 12 Company of Florida, appearing on the 02 and 03 13 dockets. 14 MS. KAUFMAN: Vicki Gordon Kaufman, 15 McWhirter, Reeves, McGlothlin, Davidson, Rief, Bakas, 16 on behalf of the Florida Industrial Power Users Group 17 in the 01, 02 and 07 dockets. 18 MR. HORTON: Norman H. Horton, Jr. of the 19 law firm of Messer, Caparello & Self, on behalf of 20 West Florida Natural Gas in the 02 docket, Sebring Gas 21 System, Inc., South Florida Natural Gas, and West 22 Florida Natural Gas in the 03 docket. 23 MR. McGEE: James McGee on behalf of Florida 24 Power Corporation in both the 02 and the 01 dockets. 25

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MR. STONE: Jeffrey A. Stone, and with me is 1 Russell A. Badders of the law firm Beggs & Lane 2 representing Gulf Power Company in the 01 and 02. 3 MR. WILLINGHAM: Bill Willingham of the law 4 firm Rutledge, Ecenia, Underwood, Purnell & Hoffman on 5 behalf of Florida Public Utilities Company in the 01, 6 02 and 03 dockets. 7 MR. LAVIA: Jay LaVia with the law firm of 8 Landers & Parsons for People's Gas in the 02 docket. 9 MR. NICHOLSON: David Nicholson, law firm of 10 Macfarlane, Ferguson & McMullen, on behalf of People's 11 Gas in the 03 docket. 12 MR. SHIEFELBEIN: Wayne Shiefelbein, Gatlin, 13 Schiefelbein & Cowdery appearing on behalf of 14 Chesapeake Utilities Corporation in the 02 and 03 15 dockets. 16 MR. HOWE: I'm Roger Howe with the Office of 17 Public Counsel appearing on behalf of the Citizens of 18 the State of Florida in the 01, 02, 03 and 07 dockets. 19 ME. JOHNSON: Vicki Johnson on behalf of the 20 Commission Staff in the 01 and 07 dockets. 21 MR. KEATING: Cochran Keating on behalf of 22 the Commission Staff in the 03 docket. 23 MS. WAGNER: Lorna Wagner on behalf of 24 Commission Staff for the 02 docket. 25

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COMMISSIONER DEASON: Thank you. If there 1 are no objections, we'll then proceed to the 07 docket 2 as the first docket we'll take up this morning. Are 3 there any preliminary matters in the 07 docket? 4 MS. JOHNSON: I'm not aware of any. 5 COMMISSIONER DEASON: Okay. Do any of the 6 parties have any preliminary matters in the 07 docket? 7 We'll proceed then into the draft prehearing order. 8 Any changes or concerns with the case 9 background procedure for handling confidential 10 information or Section 3, Prefiled Testimony and 11 Exhibits? Section 4, Order of Witnesses? Basic 12 13 Positions? I'll note, Commissioner MS. JOHNSON: 14 Deason, that TECO's witnesses are only indicated that 15 they're testifying to Issue 1. I'll let TECO make 16 that correction if necessary. 17 MR. BEASLEY: We'll correct that to 18 encompass all the issues they are testifying to. 19 COMMISSIONER DEASON: You'll provide that 20 information to Staff? 21 MR. BEASLEY: Yes. 22 COMMISSIONER DEASON: Very well. Any 23 changes or corrections to Basic Positions? 24 MS. JOHNSON: No. 25

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COMMISSIONER DEASON: Issue 1? Issue 2? 1 MS. JOHNSON: Issue 1, if FIPUG and OPC are 2 in agreement with Staff, it can be indicated as a 3 stipulated issue. 4 MS. KAUFMAN: FIPUG will just take "no 5 position." 6 MR. HOWE: Commissioner Deason, Public 7 Counsel will take no position on all the generic, 8 environmental, cost recovery issues. 9 COMMISSIONER DEASON: Issue 1 then can be 10 shown as a stipulation? 11 MS. JOHNSON: That is correct. 12 COMMISSIONER DEASON: Very well. Issue 2? 13 Issue 3? Issue 4? Issue 5? 14 MS. JOHNSON: Issue 5 can be indicated as a 15 stipulated issue. 16 COMMISSIONER DEASON: Very well. Issue 6? 17 Is there any difference of opinion on Issue 6? 18 MS. JOHNSON: No. It's just that the 19 language is somewhat different. It can be shown as a 20 stipulated issue. 21 COMMISSIONER DEASON: Do you agree, 22 Mr. Beasley, that it can be shown as a stipulation? 23 || MR. BEASLEY: I believe so, yes, sir. In 24 other words, in essence it's using the currently 25

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approved appreciation rates. 1 COMMISSIONER DEASON: Very well. Issue 7? 2 3 Issue 8? MS. JOHNSON: Staff has a correction on 4 Issue 7, our position. The third paragraph of our 5 || position states that the cost of the Gannon Station 6 || ignition oil tank upgrade should be allocated on a 7 demand, and we should insert "paren, 12CP and 1/3 AD, 8 closed paren, basis." 9 COMMISSIONER DEASON: Very well. 10 MS. JOHNSON: That's 1/13th. Correction. 11 COMMISSIONER DEASON: I was going to ask if 12 we were changing our policy. That was on Issue 7; 13 14 correct? MS. JOHNSON: That's correct. 15 COMMISSIONER DEASON: Issue 8? Issue 9A? 16 MS. JOHNSON: Excuse me, Commissioner 17 Deason. It's my understanding that TECO's position on 18 Issue 8 for their rate groups RS, RST is currently 19 shown as .333. It's my understanding it should be 20 0.033. 21 COMMISSIONER DEASON: Mr. Beasley, can you 22 23 II double-check that for us? MR. BEASLEY: I'll do that, and we'll work 24 with the Staff on that number. 25

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COMMISSIONER DEASON: Very well. Issue 9A? 1 MS. JOHNSON: Staff would like to modify its 2 position slightly, and it's still "No position at this 3 time pending receipt of outstanding discovery." 4 COMMISSIONER DEASON: Do either FIPUG or OPC 5 have a position? 6 MS. KAUFMAN: FIPUG has no position. 7 MR. HOWE: We'll take no position at this 8 time, Commissioner Deason. 9 COMMISSIONER DEASON: Issue 9B. 10 MS. JOHNSON: Staff would make the same 11 change on Issue 9B. 12 COMMISSIONER DEASON: Ms. Kaufman? 13 We have no position. MS. KAUFMAN: 14 COMMISSIONER DEASON: Mr. Howe? 15 MR. HOWE: Public Counsel would take no 16 17 position at this time. COMMISSIONER DEASON: Are there any other 18 19 issues? MS. JOHNSON: Staff is not aware of any. 20 COMMISSIONER DEASON: Very well. We'll move 21 then to Section 7, Exhibit List. Any changes or 22 corrections to that list? Very well. 23 There are no proposed stipulations other 24 than those that were just discussed this morning and 25

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there are no pending motions; is that correct? MS. JOHNSON: That's correct. COMMISSIONER DEASON: Any other matters to be brought before the prehearing officer in the 07 docket? MR. BEASLEY: Commissioner, just one. Staff has requested some discovery from Tampa Electric, and we're proceeding to prepare that on an expedited basis. We'll get it to the Staff and parties, and hope to be able to resolve some of these outstanding issues prior to the hearing. COMMISSIONER DEASON: Very well. That would then conclude the 07 docket. (Thereupon, the hearing concluded.)
