- (1) In compliance with Chapter 366.04(6)(b) F.S., 1991, the Commission adopts and incorporates by reference the 1997 1993 edition of the National Electrical Safety Code (ANSI C-2), published August 1, 1996 August 3, 1992, as the applicable safety standards for transmission and distribution facilities subject to the Commission's safety jurisdiction. Each public electric utility, rural electric cooperative, and municipal electric system shall comply with the standards in these provisions. Standards contained in the 1997 1993 edition shall be applicable to new construction for which a work order number is assigned on or after the effective date of this rule.
- (2) Each public electric utility, rural electric cooperative and municipal electric utility shall report all completed electric work orders, whether completed by the utility or one of its contractors, at the end of each quarter of the year. The report shall be filed with the Director of the Commission's Division of Electric and Gas no later than the 30th working day after the last day of the reporting quarter, and shall contain, at a minimum, the following information for each work order:
  - (a) work order number/project/job;
  - (b) brief title; and
  - (c) estimated cost in dollars, rounded to nearest thousand.

## STATEMENT OF FACTS AND CIRCUMSTANCES JUSTIFYING RULE

Section 366.04(6)(b), Florida Statutes, grants the Commission jurisdiction to prescribe and enforce safety standards for electric transmission and distribution facilities. The statute also requires the Commission to review and adopt new editions of the National Electrical Safety Code. Rule 25-6.0345 currently requires all public utilities, rural electric cooperatives, and municipal electric systems to build their transmission and distribution facilities to the standards of the 1993 version of the code. The 1997 edition of the code is now available.

Because no significant additional costs or adverse impacts have been identified and there is no other alternative to this rule that would accomplish the statutory requirement, a Statement of Estimated Regulatory Costs was not prepared.

## STATEMENT ON FEDERAL STANDARDS

There is no federal standard on the same subject.
