UTILITIES, INC.

Marion Utilities, Inc. (Marion or utility) provides water and wastewater service to approximately 4,311 water customers and 118 wastewater customers in Marion County, Florida. The utility's 1996 annual report shows an annual operating revenue of \$932,844 and a net operating income of \$80,004. The utility is a Class A utility company under FPSC jurisdiction.

On January 28, 1997 the utility applied for an amendment to Water Certificate No. 347-W in Marion County, Florida pursuant to Rule 25-30.036(3), Florida Administrative Code. The application is in compliance with the governing statute, Section 367.045, Florida Statutes, and other pertinent statutes and administrative rules concerning an application for amendment of certificate. application contains a check in the amount of \$100 which is the correct filing fee pursuant to Rule 25-30.020, Florida Administrative Code. The applicant has provided evidence, in the form of a warranty deed, that the utility owns the land upon which the utility's facilities are located as required by Rule 25-30.036(3)(d), Florida Administrative Code.

Adequate service territory and a territory description have been provided as prescribed by Rule 25-30.036(3)(e), and (i), Florida Administrative Code. A description of the territory requested by the utility is appended to this memorandum as Attachment A. The utility has submitted an affidavit consistent CMU - with Section 367.045(2)(d), Florida Statutes, that it has tariffs and annual reports on file with the Commission. In addition, the application contains proof of compliance with the noticing provisions set forth in Rule 25-30.030, Florida Administrative Code. No objections to the application have been received and the time for such has expired. The local planning agency was provided notice of the application and did not file a protest to the amendment.

The utility states that the provision of service will be consistent with the utility section of the local comprehensive plan. Service will be provided by the utility of Utreen relative and in the utility of the ut

Pines .298 million gallons per day (mgd) water treatment plant. Current maximum peaks flows at the water treatment plant are around .176 mgd. The design capacity of the proposed extension is only 16,800 gallons per day. Thus the water treatment plant has adequate capacity to serve the area.

The utility employs four Class C Operators to operate and maintain their water plants and facilities. Staff has contacted the Department of Environmental Protection and learned that there are no outstanding notices of violation issued for this system. Marion has an annual return on it investment of approximately \$78,000. The utility plans to extend their water lines to serve this customer and believes this construction cost will be about \$19,000. This minimal investment should not impact the financial position of the utility. Consequently, staff believes the utility has demonstrated the financial and technical expertise to provide quality service to these customers. Staff recommends the rates and charges approved by the Commission be applied to customers in the new service territory. The utility has filed revised tariff sheets incorporating the additional territory into its tariff and returned its certificate for entry reflecting the additional territory.

Based on the above information, staff believes it is in the public interest to grant the application of Marion for amendment of Water Certificate No. 347-S. An administrative order should be issued within 30 days granting the amendment of territory.


