DISCUSSION OF ISSUES

ISSUE 1: Should the Commission approve Gulf Power Company's (Gulf) modifications to its optional levelized billing rate schedules, Tariff Sheet Nos. ii, iii, 6.1, 6.14, and 7.24?

<u>RECOMMENDATION:</u> Yes, the Commission should approve Gulf's proposed changes to its levelized billing rate schedules. The proposed modifications will facilitate the implementation of a new customer service system and will not have any significant effect on any customer subscribing to the levelized billing plan.

STAFF ANALYSIS: The Southern Company (Southern) is in the process of implementing a new customer service system (CSS) to provide customer accounting and billing for all of its subsidiaries, including Gulf. In order to reduce operating expenses for the system, Southern is attempting to implement one set of billing procedures for all five operating companies. The CSS was originally scheduled to be available on February 1, 1997. On October 2, 1996, Gulf petitioned the Commission to approve modifications to its levelized billing plan. The modifications were made to facilitate the implementation of the CSS. The Commission approved Gulf's petition in Order No. PSC-96-1480-FOFT

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EI. However, Southern is still developing the new system and has yet to implement it. The current petition is a request for further modifications to Gulf's levelized billing plan approved in Order No. PSC-96-1480-FOF-EI.

Gulf has now proposed to include outdoor lighting service in the calculation of the monthly billing amount for levelized billing customers. Gulf has also proposed to determine the levelized billing amount on a monthly basis, as opposed to the quarterly basis which was approved in Order No. PSC-96-1480-FOF-EI. The methodology is unchanged from what was approved, only the frequency of the application will change. In addition, Gulf has proposed to change the name of the tariff from Levelized Billing (LB) to Budget Billing (BB). As a result of these changes Gulf has made some clarifications to the previous tariff language.

It is Gulf's intention to utilize Southern's new CSS when it becomes available. Staff does not believe the proposed changes will have any significant effect on any of Gulf's customers including Gulf's budget billing customers. Staff believes the proposed changes are reasonable and recommends that the changes be approved.

ISSUE 2: On what date should the proposed tariff changes become effective?

<u>RECOMMENDATION:</u> If Issue 1 is approved, the proposed tariff changes should become effective August 8, 1997.

STAPP ANALYSIS: Gulf requests that the tariff become effective August 8, 1997. Gulf maintains that this effective date will coincide with Gulf's ability to administer and implement this tariff revision in its billing system.



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ISSUE 3: Should this docket be closed?

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: Yes. If no substantially affected person files a protest within 21 days from the issuance of the order, this docket should be closed. If a protest is filed within 21 days from the issuance of the order, the tariff should remain in effect, with any increase held subject to refund, pending resolution of the protest.

STAFF ANALYSIS: If no substantially affected person files a protest within 21 days from the issuance of the order, this docket should be closed. If a protest is filed within 21 days from the issuance of the order, the tariff should remain in effect, with any increase held subject to refund, pending resolution of the protest.
