In compliance with Chapter 366.04(6)(b) F.S., 1991, the (1)3 Commission adopts and incorporates by reference the 1997 1993 4 edition of the National Electrical Safety Code (ANSI C-2), . 5 published August 1, 1996 August 3, 1992, as the applicable safety 6 standards for transmission and distribution facilities subject to 7 the Commission's safety jurisdiction. Each public electric 8 utility, rural electric cooperative, and municipal electric 9 system shall comply with the standards in these provisions. 10 Standards contained in the 1997 1993 edition shall be applicable 11 to new construction for which a work order number is assigned on 12 or after the effective date of this rule. 13

(2) Each public electric utility, rural electric 14 cooperative and municipal electric utility shall report all 15 completed electric work orders, whether completed by the utility 16 or one of its contractors, at the end of each quarter of the 17 year. The report shall be filed with the Director of the 18 Commission's Division of Electric and Gas no later than the 30th 19 working day after the last day of the reporting quarter, and 20 shall contain, at a minimum, the following information for each 21 work order: 22

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(a) work order number/project/job;

- 24 (b) brief title; and
- 25 (c) estimated cost in dollars, rounded to nearest thousand.

(4) In its quarterly report, each utility shall identify
all transmission and distribution facilities subject to the
Commission's safety jurisdiction, and shall certify to the
Commission that they meet or exceed the applicable standards.
Compliance inspections by the Commission shall be made on a
random basis or as appropriate.

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(5) As soon as practicable, but by the end of the next business day after it learns of the occurrence, each public utility, rural electric cooperative, and municipal electric utility shall (without admitting liability) report to the Commission any accident occurring in connection with any part of its transmission or distribution facilities which:

(a) Involves death or injury requiring hospitalization of
 <u>nonutility</u> non-utility persons; or

(b) Is significant from a safety standpoint in the judgment
 of the utility even though it is not required by (a).

(6) Each public utility, rural electric cooperative, and
municipal electric utility shall (without admitting liability)
report each accident or malfunction, occurring in connection with
any part of its transmission or distribution facilities, to the

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1	Commission within 30 days after it learns of the occurrence,
2	provided the accident or malfunction:
3	(a) Involves damage to the property of others in an amount
4	in excess of \$5000; or
5	(b) Causes significant damage in the judgment of the
6	utility to the utility's facilities.
7	(7) Unless requested by the Commission, reports are not
8	required with respect to personal injury, death, or property
9	damage resulting from vehicles striking poles or other utility
10	property.
