April 1997	Teleport escalated its present area blocking complaint to BellSouth, specifically to Keith Andrews, Operations Director of the Access Customer Advocate Center.

REASONS FOR TRAFFIC CHANGES

January 14, 1997 Teleport turned up BellSouth turned up additional trunks on February 14, 1997. BellSouth informed Teleport that the blocking of calls in the May 7, 1997 area was due to BellSouth's incorrect routing of calls to Teleport, due in large part to heavy overflows between BellSouth's area. BellSouth resolved the tandems in the problem by increasing the number of trunks between the tandem and Teleport from on or about May 12, 1997. to June 27, 1997 An ISP was turned up in June 27, 1997 An ISP was turned up in
