TELEPORT COMMUNICATIONS GROUP INC.'S REQUEST FOR CONFIDENTIAL CLASSIFICATION OF FRANK HOFFMANN'S LATE-FILED HEARING EXHIBIT NO. 120

Teleport Communications Group Inc. ("TCG"), by and through its undersigned counsel and pursuant to Section 364.183, Florida Statutes, and Rules 25-22.006(4) and (5), Florida Administrative Code, submits this Request for Confidential Classification of portions of Frank Hoffmann's Late-filed Hearing Exhibit No. 120 in the above-styled docket. In support of this Request, TCG states as follows:

- 1. On September 10, 1997, during the hearing in the above-styled docket, the Staff of the Florida Public Service Commission requested that TCG's witness Frank Hoffmann provide a late-filed exhibit, identified as Exhibit No. 120, that documents each time that TCG informed BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. of traffic changes and the reason for the change. TCG maintains that certain information in Late-filed Hearing Exhibit No. 120 is confidential and proprietary.
- 2. Late-filed Hearing Exhibit No. 120 identifies the name of customers who have initiated service with TCG since January, 1997, the geographic location of those customers

and the number of trunks that are required to serve these customers. This information directly relates to TCG's competitive interests. Disclosure of this information would impair TCG's competitive business interests by allowing competitors to determine the amount of traffic being transmitted over TCG's network and by providing TCG's competitors with the name and geographic location of significant TCG customers. This information is intended to be and is treated by TCG as proprietary and confidential. TCG notes that the Commission already has determined in this docket that the number of trunks that an ALEC utilizes in Florida is entitled to the protection of Section 364.183(3), Florida Statutes. See Order No. PSC-97-1039-CFO-TL, issued on September 2, 1997. TCG requests that this information be classified as "proprietary confidential business information" within the meaning of Section 364.183(3)(e), Florida Statutes.

- 3. An unedited version of Mr. Hoffmann's Late-filed Hearing Exhibit No. 120, with the information asserted to be confidential highlighted in yellow, was submitted to the Division of Records and Reporting on September 17, 1997 in conjunction with TCG's Notice of Intent to Request Confidential Classification of same. An edited version of the documents with the information asserted to be confidential blocked out is enclosed herewith.
- 4. TCG requests that the information for which it seeks confidential classification remain confidential for a period of at least 18 months as provided in Section 364.183(4), Florida Statutes.

WHEREFORE, for the foregoing reasons, TCG respectfully requests that its Request for Confidential Classification be granted.
