<u>Recommendation</u>: No. The Commission should deny Lee County's petition. It asks for an impermissibly broad statement of general applicability that would make a declaration upon the effect of statutes and rules on third persons. In addition, the petition can be denied on the merits since the capacity and energy produced by the Lee County Resource Recovery Facility falls under the category of "general" conservation goals, and does not qualify as the type of measure that may be counted toward meeting the numeric demand-side conservation goals of a utility.
