CHAIRMAN JOHNSON: We're on Item 54, a panel consisting of Johnson, Clark and Garcia.

questions. It was not clear to me on Issue 10 if the cost of transmission is used to determine the transaction price of economy Schedule C, how should the cost of this transmission be recovered?

In reading through it, is there agreement on this issue among the parties?

MR. BALLINGER: No, I don't believe so. In this one I believe Tampa Electric and Gulf wanted to credit the revenues to operating revenues.

COMMISSIONER CLARK: The transmission revenues.

MR. BALLINGER: Yes. In one case Gulf had incremental transmission revenues. TECO identified transmission revenues within the original gain and classified those as transmission revenues, and both utilities requested that they be recovered through operating revenues -- they be credited to operating revenues.

COMMISSIONER CLARE: And it's your view that the transmission revenues shouldn't go through the fuel -- should not go through the fuel clause.

MR. BALLINGER: No, they should. And 1 remember this is for a directly interconnected -maybe --3 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Oh, okay. MR. BALLINGER: Issue 12 I believe is where we -- Issue 12 is where we disagree with a wheeled sale, where you have three utilities involved at least. COMMISSIONER CLARK: Summarize for me why it is different, why it should be different. 10 MR. BALLINGER: Why it should be different? COMMISSIONER CLARK: I'm sure it's in there but it got late. 13 MR. BALLINGER: I understand. It's late. A wheeled broker sale is no different than a wheeled 15 emergency sale is no different than a wheeled 16 short-term maintenance sale. And all of those with wheeling revenues were estimated in the last rate case and included in adjusting base rates. That's why they 19 are credited back to operating revenues. Directly interconnected broker sales, this new transmission component that's just come up, was never considered. COMMISSIONER CLARK: All right. Who is the

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alternative on that?

MR. BALLINGER: I am. I'm "Judy" today.

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1	She's home sick.

22	necessarily require a full blown proceeding, right?
23	MR. BOHRMANN: No, I don't think so.
24	COMMISSIONER CLARK: I don't have any more
25	questions. I can move Staff.

2	Commissioner Garcia.
