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## PROCEEDINGS

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COMMISSIONER CLARK: Let's call the prehearing to order. Mr. Pellegrini, would you please read the notice?

MR. PELLEGRINI: This time and place having been set for a prehearing conference in Docket 971140-TP the motions of AT&T and MCI to compel BellSouth's compliance with the Commission's arbitration orders and the petition of MCI to set nonrecurring the charges for combinations of network elements pursuant to their agreement with BellSouth.

COMMISSIONER CLARK: We'll take appearances.

MS. WHITE: Nancy White for BellSouth.

MR. MELSON: Richard Melson, Hopping, Green, Sams & Smith on behalf of MCI Telecommunications Corporation and MCI Metro Access Transmission Services, Inc.

I'm also entering an appearance for Mr. Bond on behalf of the same two clients.

MR. HATCH: Tracy Hatch, appearing on behalf of the AT&T Communications of the Southern States, Inc.

MR. PELLEGRINI: Charles Pellegrini appearing on behalf of the Commission Staff.

MR. MELSON: Commissioner Clark, I'm not sure all the microphones are -- or the system is turned on.

COMMISSIONER CLARK: How is that? I don't know

how to work the one in here.

Okay. I've read through the prehearing, and are there any changes to the prehearing order?

MS. WHITE: No.

MR. MELSON: No, ma'am.

MR. HATCH: No, ma'am.

COMMISSIONER CLARK: All right. So we don't need to do anything with respect to the prehearing order, but I understand we may need to go over the order of the witnesses; is that correct?

MR. PELLEGRINI: Yes, Commissioner Clark. Let me announce at this point that we have reserved March 20th as a continuation date, if it's necessary, at 10:30.

COMMISSIONER CLARK: What day is March 20? Friday?

MR. PELLEGRINI: I think it's a Friday. Problem? COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay.

MR. PELLEGRINI: Yeah, the only things we have to do, as far as I know, this morning is to establish the order of witnesses and to determine whether or not to consolidate the testimony of witnesses who have both direct and rebuttal testimony.

COMMISSIONER CLARK: All right. I guess I'm inclined to think because we have the one day we ought to combine the testimony. Is there any objection to

combining direct and rebuttal?

MR. MELSON: No objection.

MS. WHITE: No.

MR. HATCH: No objection.

COMMISSIONER CLARK: And the order of witnesses. Where is that? Is that at the beginning?

MR. PELLEGRINI: On Page 6.

MR. MELSON: Chairman Clark, since MCI and AT&T are the moving parties, we believe our direct witnesses should precede BellSouth's, and I believe BellSouth has no problem with that.

COMMISSIONER CLARK: I agree with that. So who should go first?

MR. MELSON: Mr. Parker would be No. 1. Mr. Hyde would be No. 2. Mr. Eppsteiner would be No. 3.

Mr. Walsh would be No. 4. Mr. Gillan would be No. 5.

And this is the point at which we have a -- the parties have been unable to agree on an order from this point forward. MCI's position is that as the moving party, we typically would open and close, and we would like to have our witness, Mr. Martinez, who is a pure rebuttal witness go at the end. I believe BellSouth prefers for all of the MCI/AT&T witnesses to precede all the BellSouth witnesses.

MR. HATCH: AT&T is in the same position with

respect to Mr. Falcone.

COMMISSIONER CLARK: Ms. White, do you want to be heard on that? I guess my natural inclination is, you know, the only reason the rebuttal is going with the direct is to facilitate saving time. And I think both parties have the right to insist that their rebuttal, in fact, be presented as rebuttal.

MS. WHITE: That's fine, and all I was saying to the parties earlier was that we have had this occurrence happen before where there were witnesses who just had rebuttal testimony, and all the witnesses usually went in a group. So that's all -- the point I wanted to make. And if that makes any -- gives any sway to your decision, that's fine. If not, I can live with that too.

COMMISSIONER CLARK: It's all right. I'm still inclined to let it go as rebuttal. So it would be the direct -- it would be your direct and rebuttal and then their rebuttal.

MS. WHITE: Okay.

MR. PELLEGRINI: In that case, Commissioner Clark, Staff's Witness Young would follow Mr. Gillan, I believe. She would be Witness 6.

COMMISSIONER CLARK: If there is no objection to that, that's fine with me.

MS. WHITE: That's fine. 1 2 COMMISSIONER CLARK: And Ms. White, what about the order of your witnesses? 3 4 MS. WHITE: Mr. Varner would be No. 7. 5 Mr. Hendrix would be No. 8. Mr. Landry would be No. 9, 6 and Ms. Caldwell would be No. 10. 7 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. 8 MS. WHITE: And I don't know how late you planned 9 on going that Monday night, but Ms. Caldwell is going to have to catch a flight that night to South Carolina, 10 11 so she may have to be moved ahead somewhat if it looks 12 like we're anywhere near getting to her. 13 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Let's make that notation in 14 the prehearing order, that if she is going to testify 15 on the 9th, it will have to be early enough so she can 16 catch a flight. 17 MS. WHITE: Thank you. 18 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Then who is 11 and who is 12? 19 20 MR. MELSON: Mr. Martinez would be No. 11 and 21 Mr. Falcone would be No. 12. 22 COMMISSIONER CLARK: All right. That's 23 satisfactory to me. Anything else? 24 MR. HATCH: Just another notation with respect to 25 Mr. Gillan. He really needs to go on Monday because he

1 has a prior commitment in another state on Tuesday and Wednesday. 2 3 COMMISSIONER CLARK: We'll make that note, and you all will have to work that out. 5 MR. HATCH: Yes ma'am, I understand. Just wanted 6 to make you aware. 7 MR. PELLEGRINI: Are any of the witnesses 8 unavailable on March 20th, at this point, to your 9 knowledge? 10 MR. HATCH: I don't know. I'll have to check, but 11 I will let you know. 12 MS. WHITE: We'll have to check that out as well. 13 And one more just procedural thing, Mr. Bennett 14 Ross will be at the hearing trying the case with me. 15 He's an attorney licensed to practice in Georgia in 16 good standing, and I would ask that he be allowed to 17 participate in this hearing for BellSouth. 18 COMMISSIONER CLARK: We'll allow him to make an 19 appearance on behalf of BellSouth in this proceeding. 20 MS. WHITE: Thank you. 21 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Anything else? 22 MR. MELSON: No, ma'am. 23 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Thank you all very much. The prehearing is adjourned. 24 25 (Prehearing conference concluded at 9:37 a.m.)
