PERIOD FOR ACTIVITIES: January, February, and March 1998

## **PROGRAM STATUS:**

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The FPL Premium Lighting and Recreational Lighting Tariffs and Rate Schedules were approved by the Commission in Order PSC-98-0260-FOF-EI, dated January 20, 1998. These are optional Tariff Offerings intended to meet the specific needs of FPL Customers who desire a greater variety in poles and fixtures. The Commission also ordered FPL to file quarterly reports listing customers who take service under the Premium Lighting and Recreational Lighting rate schedules, the rates paid by those customers, and the types of fixtures and poles rented by the customers.

## **ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED:**

FPL has not signed any FPL Customers to either the Premium Lighting or Recreational Lighting rate schedule during the First Quarter of 1998.

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
