

Issue 2: Should this docket be closed?

<u>Recommendation</u>: If the Commission approves Issue 1 and no timely protest is filed, this docket should be closed. If a protest is filed within 21 days of issuance of the order, this docket should remain open and the tariff should remain in effect pending resolution of the protest. In addition, revenues collected pursuant to the tariff should be held subject to refund until final resolution of the protest.
