Dear Landowner:

Marion County has been notified that your property located in southwest Marion County is proposed to be certificated into the Marion Oaks water and wastewater service area. The owner of the utility, Florida Water Services, Inc. (FWS) has filed an application with the Florida Public Service Commission (FPSC) to expand its service area in Marion County to include the area between State Road 200 and Interstate 75 and south of County Road 484 to the Sumter County border. If approved FWS will be the exclusive provider of central water and wastewater utility service. This means that new development will be required to hook up to the Marion Oaks system and be subject to monthly rates that are higher than those of other utilities including the County utilities department. FWS (a for-profit private investor owned utility) will determine which property can be economically served and how capacity is equitably allocated under jurisdiction of the FPSC.

If you do not wish to become part of the FWS service area you can send a written objection to the FPSC stating your concerns. Such letters should be addressed to Director, Division of Records and Reporting, Florida Public Service Commission, 2540 Shumard Oak Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida, 32399-0870.
