NOTICE OF PROPOSED AGENCY ACTION ORDER APPROVING TRANSFER OF INTEREXCHANGE TELECOMMUNICATIONS CERTIFICATE

BY THE COMMISSION:

NOTICE is hereby given by the Florida Public Service Commission that the action discussed herein is preliminary in nature and will become final unless a person whose interests are substantially affected files a petition for a formal proceeding, pursuant to Rule 25-22.029, Florida Administrative Code.

On October 29, 1997, Invision Telecom, Inc. (Invision) and Talton Invision, Inc. (Talton) filed with this Commission a joint request for transfer of Interexchange Telecommunications (IXC) Certificate No. 3123 from Invision to Talton.

Invision and Talton have complied with Rule 25-24.473, Florida Administrative Code, regarding the transfer of IXC certificates. We find the transfer to be in the public interest and, therefore, approve the transfer. IXC Certificate No. 3123 shall be amended to reflect that Talton is the holder of this certificate.

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If this Order becomes final and effective, it shall serve as Talton's certificate. It should, therefore, be retained by Talton as proof of certification.

IXCs are subject to Chapter 25-24, Florida Administrative Code, Part X, Rules Governing Telephone Service Provided by Interexchange Telephone Companies. IXCs are also required to comply with all applicable provisions of Chapter 364, Florida Statutes, and Chapters 25-4, Florida Administrative Code. Further, pursuant to the provisions of Order No. 16804, issued November 4, 1986, IXCs may not construct facilities to bypass a local exchange company without the prior approval of this Commission.

Based on the foregoing, it is

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that the request for transfer of Interexchange Telecommunications Certificate No. 3123 from Invision Telecom, Inc. to Talton Invision, Inc., is hereby approved. It is further

ORDERED that Interexchange Telecommunications Certificate No. 3123 shall be amended to reflect that Talton Invision, Inc., is the holder of this certificate.

ORDERED that Talton Invision, Inc. Interexchange Telecommunications service Certificate No. 3123 is subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the body of this Order. It is further

ORDERED that this Order will serve as Talton Invision, Inc.'s certificate and that this Order should be retained as proof of certification and as evidence of the name change. It is further

ORDERED that the provisions of this Order, issued as proposed agency action, shall become final and effective unless an appropriate petition, in the form provided by Rule 28-106.201, Florida Administrative Code, is received by the Director, Division of Records and Reporting, 2540 Shumard Oak Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0850, by the close of business on the date set forth in the "Notice of Further Proceedings or Judicial Review" attached hereto. It is further

ORDERED that in the event this Order becomes final, this Docket shall be closed.

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NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.569(1), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing or judicial review of Commission orders that is available under Sections 120.57 or 120.68, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing or judicial review will be granted or result in the relief sought.

Mediation may be available on a case-by-case basis. If mediation is conducted, it does not affect a substantially interested person's right to a hearing.

The action proposed herein is preliminary in nature. Any person whose substantial interests are affected by the action proposed by this order may file a petition for a formal proceeding, in the form provided by Rule 28-106.201, Florida Administrative Code. This petition must be received by the Director, Division of Records and Reporting, 2540 Shumard Oak Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0850, by the close of business on September 14, 1998.

In the absence of such a petition, this order shall become effective on the day subsequent to the above date.

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Any objection or protest filed in this docket before the issuance date of this order is considered abandoned unless it satisfies the foregoing conditions and is renewed within the specified protest period.

If this order becomes final and effective on the date described above, any party substantially affected may request judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility or by the First District Court of Appeal in the case of a water or wastewater utility by filing a notice of appeal with the Director, Division of Records and Reporting and filing a copy of the notice of appeal and the filing fee with the appropriate court. This filing must be completed within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this order, pursuant to Rule 9.110, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure. The notice of appeal must be in the form specified in Rule 9.900(a), Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
