RESPONSE TO MOTION TO DISMISS

COMES NOW, protestant Utilicore Corp. and files this response to the Motion to Dismiss filed by American Phone Corp (APC). In response, Utilicore would show:

- On November 16, 1998, Utilicore, a certificated ALEC, filed a formal protest to Order No. PSC 98-1464-FOF-TX, a proposed agency action (PAA) order granting an ALEC certificate to American Phone Corp. Attached to the letter protest were copies of correspondence and a complaint filed by Utilicore.
- On or about December 12, 1998, APC filed a Motion to Dismiss asserting basically
 that Utilicore had failed to demonstrate how its substantial interests were affected and that the protest
 was not in substantial compliance with the requirements of Rule 28-106.201, Florida Administrative
 Code.
- 3. American Phone is attempting to put form over substance. The correspondence and attachments present the basis for the protest and demonstrate that the interests of Utilicore and the public will be adversely affected by the issuance of the certificate to American Phone because APC is and has utilized assets and arrangements of Utilicore to support its certification.. It is incumbent upon the applicant, APC, to demonstrate that it has sufficient technical, financial and managerial capability to provide service and, as reflected in the complaint and release from the SEC, the FPSC should question whether that burden has been met. The FPSC is not required to issue a certificate

unless these criteria are met. Utilicore would submit that there is a basis for the protest and the Motion to Dismiss should be denied.

For the reasons cited, Utilicore requests that the Motion to Dismiss be denied and that the Commission consider the protest filed by Utilicore.
