COMMISSIONER CLARK: Is Grace there, Grace Jaye?

MS. JAYE: Yes.

COMMISSIONER CLARK: Grace, will you please read the notice?

MS. JAYE: Certainly, Commissioner.

Pursuant to notice issued December 21st, 1998, this time and place have been set aside for a prehearing in Docket Number 980002-EG, Energy Conservation Cost Recovery Clause.

COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. We'll take appearances. Can you hear me?

MS. COWDERY: This is Kathryn Cowdery with Ruden, McClosky, Smith, Schuster & Russell in Tallahassee, on behalf of Chesapeake Utilities Corporation.

MR. ROBINSON: This is James M. Robinson, of Macfarlane, Ferguson & McMullen, P.O. Box 1531, Tampa, Florida, 33601, appearing for Peoples Gas in the conservation cost recovery docket.

MR. BEASLEY: Jim Beasley with the law firm of Ausley & McMullen in Tallahassee. I'm representing Tampa Electric Company.

MR. PALECKI: Michael Palecki, 955 East 25th Street, Hialeah, Florida, representing City Gas Company of Florida.

1 MR. HOFFMAN: Kenneth Hoffman, Post Office  
2 Box 551, Tallahassee, Florida, 32302, on behalf of Florida  
3 Public Utilities Company.

4 MR. HOWE: I'm Roger Howe with the Office of the  
5 Public Counsel appearing on behalf of the citizens of the  
6 State of Florida.

7 MS. GORDON KAUFMAN: Vicki Gordon Kaufman,  
8 McWhirter, Reeves, 117 South Gadsden Street, Tallahassee,  
9 32301, appearing on behalf of the Florida Industrial Power  
10 Users Group.

11 MS. JAYE: Grace A. Jaye on behalf Commission  
12 staff.

13 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Grace, do we have any  
14 preliminary matters to take up?

15 MS. JAYE: Yes, ma'am. It was brought to staff's  
16 attention this morning that exhibits for Chesapeake  
17 Utilities Corporation were inadvertently left out of the  
18 draft prehearing order, and those will be inserted.

19 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. So you'll just add  
20 them to the prehearing order before I sign it?

21 MS. JAYE: Yes.

22 COMMISSIONER CLARK: All right. Let me ask this  
23 question: Are there any other changes to the prehearing  
24 order through Page 4?

25 MS. JAYE: Let me take a moment and look through

1 it real quickly.

2 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay.

3 MS. JAYE: No, ma'am, not that I can see, unless  
4 the parties have some changes. They are indicating there  
5 are no changes.

6 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Thank you.

7 MR. PALECKI: Yes, City Gas Company of Florida.  
8 Only through Page 4, we have no changes, but we would  
9 change our positions later on in the prehearing order.

10 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. Are there any changes  
11 to the order of witnesses?

12 MS. JAYE: No one is indicating that there are  
13 any.

14 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. Any changes to basic  
15 positions?

16 MS. COWDERY: Commissioner Clark.

17 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Is this Kathryn?

18 MS. COWDERY: Yeah, this is Kathryn for  
19 Chesapeake. The only thing I would do as far as basic  
20 positions go is note that it will be as stated except we  
21 are going to stipulate with staff's numbers. There were  
22 some very minor changes.

23 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay.

24 MS. COWDERY: And other than that, it would be as  
25 stated.

1 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Anyone else?

2 (NO RESPONSE)

3 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Should we go to Issue 1  
4 then?

5 MS. JAYE: Yes, Commissioner.

6 COMMISSIONER CLARK: All right. Are there any  
7 changes to Issue 1? And Grace, I guess you should let me  
8 know if any of the -- if there is any stipulation.

9 MS. JAYE: Yes, Commissioner. There have been  
10 none set forth yet by parties.

11 COMMISSIONER CLARK: I'm sorry. Say that again.

12 MS. JAYE: I have heard of no stipulations being  
13 proposed by parties.

14 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay.

15 MS. COWDERY: Commissioner, again, just Issue 1,  
16 Chesapeake would stipulate to staff's number of \$61,063  
17 under recovery.

18 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay.

19 MS. GORDON KAUFMAN: Commissioner, this Vicki  
20 Kaufman, and FIPUG would take no position on Issue 1.

21 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Do you want your position  
22 left as stated?

23 MS. GORDON-KAUFMAN: No, I would just like it to  
24 reflect no position.

25 COMMISSIONER CLARK: No position?

1 MS. GORDON-KAUFMAN: Yes, ma'am.

2 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay.

3 MR. PALECKI: Commissioner, this is Mike Palecki.  
4 City Gas Company of Florida would stipulate to staff's  
5 number, which is 239,738.

6 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. Peoples Gas?

7 MR. ROBINSON: There is no stipulation at this  
8 time.

9 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. Is that also for --  
10 Is that the West Florida District? I'm sorry, if there is  
11 no stipulation for Peoples Gas, then what is PGS-WFD?

12 MR. ROBINSON: No, there is not.

13 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. Any other changes?  
14 Any other stipulations?

15 MR. HOFFMAN: Commissioner Clark, this is Ken  
16 Hoffman for Florida Public Utilities. Our number agrees  
17 with staff's number, so I think we have a stipulation on  
18 Issue 1.

19 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay.

20 MR. BEASLEY: Commissioner, Jim Beasley for Tampa  
21 Electric, the same would apply for Tampa Electric.

22 MR. HOWE: Commissioner Clark, this is Roger  
23 Howe. For Public Counsel's position, we will agree with  
24 staff.

25 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. I take it that leaves

1 only Peoples Gas has not stipulated? No, there is one  
2 other.

3 MR. ROBINSON: I apologize, Commissioner. There  
4 is -- just looking at this now, I see that there is a  
5 difference between our evidence as presented and the  
6 numbers of staff, and I have not been in contact or do I  
7 know of any contact to settle those discrepancies.

8 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Is this Mr. Robinson?

9 MR. ROBINSON: Yes, it is.

10 MS. BULECZA-BANKS: This is Cheryl Bulecza-Banks  
11 speaking on behalf of staff. What has happened,  
12 apparently, in the PGS issues for their end-of-period  
13 true-up is they accidentally pulled the wrong amount off  
14 the form. They took a different number which is not the  
15 final end-of-period true-up. What they pulled was a  
16 variance, and they have to, essentially have to agree with  
17 staff because we have the same factors. In order to get  
18 the factors, they would have to have the same  
19 end-of-true-up amount. So I think they just need to get  
20 back with the staff at their company and verify that our  
21 numbers are actually accurate.

22 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. And they'll have the  
23 opportunity to do that before we issue the order, right,  
24 the prehearing order?

25 MS. JAYE: Yes, Commissioner.



1 MR. ROBINSON: Yes. Yes, Commissioner.

2 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. Who is SJNG? Who is  
3 representing them?

4 MR. ROBINSON: St. Joe's.

5 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Who is representing them?

6 MS. JAYE: They are not represented here today.

7 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Do they agree with staff?  
8 Does that number agree with staff on Issue 1, the under  
9 recovery of one million -- no, I guess it's one thousand  
10 457?

11 MS. BULECZA-BANKS: St. Joe likewise pulled the  
12 wrong number, and we'll have to call them and verify  
13 because our factors are the same; and in order to have the  
14 same factors, again, they'd have to have the same under  
15 recovery. They pulled the same number that Peoples pulled.  
16 They just pulled it off the wrong place.

17 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay, Cheryl. Are they  
18 going to be represented?

19 MS. BULECZA-BANKS: They never are. They haven't  
20 in the ten years I've been doing this.

21 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay.

22 MS. BULECZA-BANKS: They just don't show up.

23 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. All right. So it  
24 looks like we might possibly stipulate Issue 1, right?

25 MS. JAYE: Yes. We'll look into that.

1 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. Issue 2.

2 MS. COWDERY: Commissioner, this is Kathryn  
3 Cowdery for Chesapeake. Again, we'd stipulate with staff  
4 so that our position is the same as listed except for GS  
5 residential, which we'd use the staff number of 6.517.

6 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay.

7 MR. PALECKI: Commissioner, this is Mike Palecki.  
8 City Gas Company would stipulate with staff's numbers, and  
9 those are residential, 5.087 -- excuse me, 5.078 cents per  
10 therm; commercial 1.189 cents per therm; and commercial  
11 large volume, .972 cents per therm.

12 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. Peoples Gas.

13 MR. ROBINSON: Commissioner, as to Peoples Gas,  
14 we stipulate to the staff's numbers.

15 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay.

16 MR. ROBINSON: As to the West Florida region for  
17 Peoples Gas, we note that there is one rate class that has  
18 been omitted from staff's recommendation; and that is,  
19 commercial large volume transportation. That is our fourth  
20 line, and they do not include it, and we submitted it as  
21 0.990.

22 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Is that acceptable to staff?

23 MR. ROBINSON: Excuse me, Commissioner?

24 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Is that acceptable to staff?

25 MS. BULECZA-BANKS: Yes, it is.

1           COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. Mr. Hoffman, Florida  
2 Public Utilities.

3           MR. HOFFMAN: Commissioner Clark, we have reached  
4 a stipulation with the staff on Issue 2, which includes one  
5 contingency which I'll explain to you.

6           An issue was raised in the draft prehearing order  
7 concerning a three-thousand-dollar expense item which, not  
8 surprisingly, has a very minimal impact on our factor. And  
9 the issue concerns some expenditures for a conservation  
10 program that has been implemented for a number of years by  
11 the company called a "Good Cents Program." I had the  
12 opportunity to talk to staff shortly before the prehearing  
13 conference began, and we have reached a stipulation to  
14 allow the company to recover these expenditures while both  
15 staff and the company further explore the issue. We'll  
16 provide some additional information to staff that they may  
17 need, and in the event staff would continue to take the  
18 position that the three-thousand expenditure should be  
19 disallowed and that position is taken at the next hearing,  
20 then the three thousand dollars would be refunded with an  
21 appropriate interest rate.

22           COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay.

23           MR. HOFFMAN: And I think I've accurately stated  
24 that.

25           MS. JAYE: Yes, sir, you have.

1           COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. Then we'll show that  
2 stipulated with that contingency.

3           COMMISSIONER CLARK: TECO.

4           MR. BEASLEY: Commissioner Clark, our numbers are  
5 in agreement with those of the staff, so we can stipulate  
6 these factors.

7           COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. Ms. Kaufman.

8           MS. GORDON KAUFMAN: Commissioner Clark, FIPUG is  
9 going to take no position on this issue.

10          COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay.

11          MR. HOWE: And, Commissioner Clark, this is Roger  
12 Howe. Public Counsel will take no position on this issue.

13          COMMISSIONER CLARK: Staff, it appears then that  
14 we have a stipulation on Issue 2?

15          MS. JAYE: Yes, ma'am.

16          COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. Issue 3, nobody has a  
17 position but the staff on this?

18          MS. JAYE: Commissioner, staff had, after some  
19 deliberation, decided that we needed to clarify the  
20 effective dates for the new conservation cost recovery  
21 factors because of the contingencies involved in going from  
22 the two times a year to one time a year for holding these  
23 hearings, and staff had included this issue sort of as a  
24 means to allow the companies to know exactly where we are  
25 coming from and what is required. The companies have not

1 had an opportunity to respond, and I was hoping that we  
2 could maybe get a response today, you know, from them after  
3 looking at this, if they can agree that these are, indeed,  
4 the time periods that we are discussing.

5 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. Let's start with City  
6 Gas -- I mean Chesapeake.

7 MS. COWDERY: Okay. Commissioner, we can  
8 stipulate to staff's position.

9 COMMISSIONER CLARK: City Gas.

10 MR. PALECKI: City Gas stipulates to staff's  
11 position.

12 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Mr. Robinson.

13 MR. ROBINSON: Peoples stipulates to staff's  
14 position, and the West Florida District of Peoples  
15 stipulates to staff's position as well.

16 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Mr. Hoffman.

17 MR. HOFFMAN: Commissioner Clark, subject to  
18 check, and I would like the opportunity to contact my  
19 client about this, we stipulate to staff's position; and I  
20 fully anticipate that he will confirm that position.

21 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. TECO.

22 MR. BEASLEY: Commissioner, Jim Beasley. If I  
23 could inquire, staff's position states, "The factors should  
24 be effective beginning with the specified conservation cost  
25 recovery cycle," and I just wondered what that -- just for

1 clarification what that phrase refers to, "The specified  
2 conservation cost recovery cycle." If it means the April  
3 through December 1999 period, we are in agreement.

4 MS. JAYE: Yes, it does.

5 MR. BEASLEY: Okay.

6 MS. JAYE: It's the first billing which includes  
7 April 1st through the billing which includes December 31st,  
8 even though those billing cycles may actually begin, for  
9 instance, in March and end in January.

10 MR. BEASLEY: Got you. Okay. Then we would  
11 accept staff's position on that issue.

12 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. FIPUG.

13 MS. GORDON-KAUFMAN: We can agree with staff,  
14 Commissioner Clark.

15 MR. HOWE: And the same for Public Counsel.

16 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. Ms. Jaye, then it  
17 appears we probably have -- this whole proceeding is  
18 stipulated.

19 MS. JAYE: Yes, it does, subject to check for  
20 FPUC.

21 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Right. Then I think it is  
22 appropriate to indicate that we will excuse all the  
23 witnesses after you've checked to make sure that other  
24 commissioners on this hearing do not need to have them  
25 present, and then when we convene the hearing, we'll

1 stipulate the evidence into the record and accept the  
2 stipulation.

3 MS. JAYE: Very well, Commissioner.

4 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Is there anything else we  
5 have to take up at this time?

6 MR. HOFFMAN: Commissioner Clark, this is Ken  
7 Hoffman. Assuming that we have the stipulations and that  
8 the commissioners do not have questions, would counsel be  
9 excused from the hearing as well?

10 COMMISSIONER CLARK: That would be fine with me.  
11 Grace, if you would make sure that all the Commissioners  
12 know that.

13 MS. JAYE: Yes, ma'am.

14 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. Thank you all very  
15 much.

16 MS. JAYE: Thank you.

17 (WHEREUPON, THE PREHEARING CONFERENCE WAS  
18 ADJOURNED)
