Financial Capability

BlueStar is financially qualified to provide telecommunications services within the State of Florida. Specifically, it has access to the capital required to fulfill any obligations it may undertake with respect to the operation and maintenance of its network and services throughout the State of Florida, including any lease or ownership obligations it may undertake. As evidenced by the financial statements attached hereto, BlueStar has already raised substantial capital from private investors. Most recently, BlueStar's parent, BlueStar Properties, Inc., closed on an additional equity round with two groups of professional venture investors that added \$6 million of equity capital. BlueStar will have direct access to this additional capital, which will be used to fund its operations and maintain its statewide service. The Company also has \$1,000,000 of working capital from Ascend Communications, Inc. ("Ascend"), a publicly-traded company who recently announced it is merging with Lucent Technologies, Inc. Additionally, Ascend, a leading telecommunications and digital subscriber line ("DSL") equipment manufacturer and supplier, and BlueStar have entered into a multi-million dollar equipment financing agreement, which will allow BlueStar to build its network in the State of Florida.

Managerial and Technical Capabilities

BlueStar also has the managerial and technical abilities necessary to operate its DSL network and to provide both business and residential customers in the State of Florida with high-quality, high-speed Internet access, LAN extension, web hosting services, telecommuting, frame relay, encryption, virtual private networks, and content provisioning. BlueStar has received authority to and currently is operating its DSL networks in Tennessee and Kentucky. BlueStar has negotiated a region-wide interconnection agreement with BellSouth.

BlueStar is led by a highly-skilled management team and will bolster its knowledge and experience with the telecommunications and business expertise of Ascend. BlueStar's management team is as follows:

Fredjoseph Goldner, Chief Executive Officer and President

Mr. Goldner has had extensive Internet and networking experience. For example, he has developed applications for a software company deploying an electronic medical record system over the Internet and building data infrastructure nationally and internationally. Mr. Goldner also possesses expertise in encryption, networking, data warehousing, and application development. Before BlueStar, he was employed by KPMG Peat Marwick to develop their electronic commerce and consulting practice. He has also worked on large projects internationally, including managing the logistics and data network implementation for 2000+employees of NBC and the 1992 Barcelona Summer Olympics. In addition, Mr. Goldner was in charge of the operations for United Parcel Service in Costa Rica, where he oversaw and managed customer service, market development, and logistics for the Caribbean region. Furthermore, he managed the complete logistics of a healthcare company expanding its services in Mexico. He handled all contracts and negotiations as well as the data networking and telecommunications topology between its United States corporate headquarters and Mexico. Mr. Goldner holds an MBA in finance from Columbia University.

Richard Burtner, Chief Financial Officer and Secretary

Mr. Burtner has assisted in raising \$165 million of venture, private equity and debt capital for several companies. An innovative professional with a diverse background, Mr. Burtner has more than 20 years experience in financial and business management in the areas of start-up companies, healthcare, distribution, manufacturing, service, systems implementation, profit generation, mergers and acquisitions and cash management. Mr. Burtner served as the Vice President of Finance at Dover Elevator Company, a \$400 million distribution, construction and service business with approximately 70 branch offices around the United States. Mr. Burtner also served as CFO, for more than four years, at a \$50 million Southeast regional construction, service and environmental company and as a Controller for a \$200 million international manufacturer. Mr. Burtner spent the first eight years of his career employed by a "Big Six" public accounting firm. Mr. Burtner holds a B.A. in accounting from Duke University.

Scott Kozicki, Chief Technical Officer

Mr. Kozicki has been a pioneering force in the development of the Internet in Nashville, Tennessee and is responsible for designing and implementing some of that city's most recognized corporate websites. Mr. Kozicki began his career as a graphic designer but expanded his expertise into multimedia production and, by the early 1990s, into Internet development. While serving as an independent consultant, he assisted the nation's top corporations, such as Disney, Pepsi, Alcoa, Nortel, Pizza Hut, Apple Computer, Saturn, and Nissan, by developing enterprise-grade network-based applications. As an independent consultant, Mr. Kozicki frequently was responsible for complete overhauls of corporate networks to take advantage of Internet-based applications and technologies. He is certified by Novell and Microsoft as a systems and network engineer and has seven years of experience in Internet-protocol based networks and applications. From 1997 through early 1998, Mr. Kozicki was actively involved in deploying advanced Internet-based applications for Service Merchandise corporation, including the company's website and several mission critical Intranet applications.

Mr. Kozicki has used his broad experience and expertise in the development and deployment of Internet systems and advanced data services to oversee and manage the implementation and operation of BlueStar's networks in Tennessee and Kentucky since their inception. Through the last 18 months, Mr. Kozicki has been responsible for overseeing BlueStar's diligent testing of its DSL-based technologies and various network implementations to determine the best network design for providing advanced telecommunications services through the public switched telephone network. BlueStar's testing results and designs have been used by BlueStar's equipment vendors in deployments in other areas around the country. In designing its network, Mr. Kozicki consulted with companies and individuals with expertise in ATM, frame relay, and the public switched telephone network to validate and critique BlueStar's DSL-based network design to ensure a robust implementation.

Mr. Kozicki also has been responsible for creating the deployment and customer service teams associated with BlueStar's services. Mr. Kozicki has used his extensive experience working with the telecommunications departments of major corporations as well as several Regional Bell Operating Companies to assemble quickly a team of seasoned installation technicians already familiar with the public switched telephone network, as well as expert data services engineers. With BlueStar's serious focus on customer care, Mr. Kozicki is building a service system that scales to the thousands, but provides individual attention and immediate access.

BlueStar will receive additional technical support for 1999 from an on-site, full-time Network Engineer assigned to BlueStar and supplied by Ascend, who will assist BlueStar in implementing and coordinating BlueStar's DSL network and the equipment necessary to provide DSL service. Ascend is a leading provider of technology and equipment solutions for telecommunications carriers, Internet service providers, and corporate customers worldwide. It has extensive experience in building carrier and Internet service provider networks, providing enterprise connections to public network facilities, and providing enterprise wide access networks

(WANs). Ascend is the number one provider of frame relay and ATM equipment to service providers worldwide.

The current Ascend consultant is Don Simpson. The addition of Mr. Simpson will complement Mr. Kozicki's and Mr. Terrence Peters' experience and provide sufficient technical qualifications to deploy DSL and render excellent service to BlueStar's customers. Mr. Simpson has extensive experience with the telecommunications industry. BlueStar will also have the full support of Ascend's Professional Services Department for other individuals with telecommunications experiences, where required.

BlueStar has also continued to build its in-house technical staff. Currently, BlueStar has 7 technical personnel (in addition to the Ascend Network Engineer), all of whom have worked for or with telecommunications or Internet companies. Before it begins actual operations in Florida, BlueStar will establish a technical presence in the state.
