Dear Mr. Knowlton:

During a phone conversation in March, 1999, you stated that you discovered that a bank located in your certificated area is being provided wastewater service by Crooked Lake and has never been billed by the utility. On March 24, 1999, you faxed a copy of the bank's water usage for the months January, 1998, through February, 1999. The staff engineer has visited the utility's service area and verified that the utility is providing wastewater service to the bank.

Rule 25-30.350, Florida Administrative Code, states that a utility may not backbill customers for any period greater than 12 months for any undercharge in billing, which is the result of the utility's mistake. It also states that the utility shall allow the customer to pay for the unbilled service over the same time period as the time period during which the underbilling occurred or some other mutually agreeable time period.

Following the guidelines of Rule 25-30.350, F.A.C., I have calculated the amount for backbilling the American Bank and Trust. This calculation is based on the bank's consumption from March, 1998 through February, 1999 times the tariffed rates for a general service customer (see attached tariff sheet). The calculation is as follows:

I have included the unbilled revenue of \$1,058 for the bank in test year revenue for the current rate case in Docket No. 980778-SU. The number of bills and consumption for the bank has also been included in the calculation of rates in the current rate case.

In addition, Regulatory Assessment Fees (RAFs) at 4.5% are due on the unbilled revenue for the bank. The period used for calculating the unbilled revenue is March, 1998 through February, 1999. The amount for RAFs for the unbilled revenue for the period March, 1998 through December, 1998 is \$43.51 (\$966.90 x .0450). This payment is due 30 days from the date the utility receives the last payment of unbilled revenue from the bank for the period March, 1998 through December, 1998. The unbilled revenue for the period January, 1999 and Fevruary, 1999 should be recorded on the utility's books and included in the utility's 1999 Annual Report. RAFs for this time period should be reported and paid along with RAFs that will be due March 31, 2000.

Based on the staff audit for the current rate case, your utility did not bill one of its customers, the mobile home park, for December, 1997 and January, 1998. The amount of unbilled revenue for the mobile home park is \$2,153. The RAFs due is \$96.89. This payment should be made 30 days from receipt of this letter.

When you decide the payment plan for the backbilling, please notify me. The check for payment of the regulatory assessment fee should be made payable to the Florida Public Service Commission for the amount due.
