Recommendation: Yes. The Commission should order Payphone to show cause in writing within 21 days of the date of the order why it should not have Certificate No. 5607 canceled or be fined \$600 for apparent violation of Rule 25-24.515, Florida Administrative Code. Payphone's response must contain specific allegations of fact or law. If Payphone fails to respond to the show cause, and the fine is not paid after reasonable collection

efforts by the Commission, Certificate No. 5607 should be canceled. If the fine is paid it will be remitted by the Commission to the State of Florida General Revenue Fund pursuant to Section 364.285, Florida Statutes.

Issue 2: Should this docket be closed?

Recommendation: If staff's recommendation in Issue 1 is approved, then
Payphone will have 21 days from issuance of the Commission's show cause
order to respond in writing why it should not be fined in the amount
proposed or have its certificate canceled. If Payphone timely responds to
the show cause order, this docket should remain open pending resolution of
the show cause proceeding. If the fine is paid, it should be forwarded to
the Office of the Comptroller for deposit in the General Revenue Fund
pursuant to Section 364.285(1), Florida Statutes, and this docket should be
closed. Staff recommends that if Payphone fails to respond to the Order to
Show Cause, and the fine is not received within five business days after
expiration of the show cause response period, Payphone's certificate should
be canceled and this docket closed.
