On August 3, 1999, the Department received a copy of the Aloha Utilities Corporation application for amendment of its certification for water and wastewater service in Pasco County. Pursuant to the Memorandum of Understanding between the Public Service Commission (PSC) and the Department of Community Affairs, the Department will provide information to the PSC regarding the relationship of the certificate application and the Pasco County Comprehensive Plan, including information about the land use categories, including densities and intensities of use. Also, information regarding patterns of development, and service needs in the County. The Department has completed its review and offers the following comments:

Based on the current Pasco County Comprehensive Plan, the exchange of service areas between Pasco County and Aloha Utilities is consistent with the Pasco County Comprehensive Plan. The residential density of territory that is to be exchanged between the County and Aloha Utilities ranges from three to nine dwelling units an acre. The territory exchange is within a rapidly urbanizing area of Pasco County.
