2	(Hearing convened at 1:35 p.m.)
3	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Call the prehearing to
4	order. Take appearances. We'll read the Notice.
5	MR. JAEGER: Pursuant to Notice issued
6	October 21, 1999 this time and place has been set for
7	a prehearing conference in Docket No. 960545-WS,
8	Investigation of Utility Rates of Aloha
9	Utilities, Inc. in Pasco County.
10	COMMISSIONER CLARK: We'll take appearances.
11	MR. DETERDING: Marshall Deterding here on
12	behalf of Aloha Utilities.
13	MR. MCLEAN: Harold Mclean, 111 West Madison
14	Street, Tallahassee, Florida, 32399 here on behalf of
15	the Citizens of the state of Florida.
16	MR. JAEGER: Harold, are you also
17	representing Representative Fasano today?
18	MR. MCLEAN: Yes.
19	MR. JAEGER: And I'm Ralph Jaeger and with
20	me is Jason Fudge on behalf of Commission Staff.
21	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Mr. Deterding, will
22	Mr. Jenkins be representing the utility with you in

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this case?

MR. DETERDING: At hearing it will likely be

COMMISSIONER CLARK: All right. Well, we'll just show your name on the prehearing. Okay.

MR. JAEGER: Several preliminary matters. First thing is, I'm not sure -- I think the Chairman is letting the Commissioners know, but he's stated that the hearing needs to be moved to the 16th and 17th of December, not 13th and 14th as originally scheduled.

**COMMISSIONER CLARK:** Okay.

MR. JAEGER: And I've talked with Sandy
Moses today and she got a room, but it's about
two-thirds the size of what we had before. We had
like a 300 capacity and now it's a little bit over
200. If you remember the number of customers that
came to the last hearing, we had close to 500
customers, I believe, show up on the first day of the
hearing. So this may be tight and it's also moved it
closer to Christmas, but the Chairman wanted -- he
needed the dates on the 13th, 14th and 15th and he
said that this will be moved to the 16th and 17th, if
at all possible.

COMMISSIONER CLARK: When are we going to have the customer hearings?

MR. JAEGER: They were going to do it the morning on Thursday, or -- well, we were going to do

it Monday, of course, but now Thursday at 10:00 and also I think at 6:30 in the evening on the first day.

COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. Well, I appreciate you telling me that. I'm not sure I have a choice. I'm not sure any of us have a choice.

MR. JAEGER: I don't think any of us were given a choice.

Other preliminary matters, Commissioner, on November 10th, OPC and Representative Fasano, as intervenors, filed two motions; one was to correct Schrivener's error and one was to strike certain testimony and exhibits of rebuttal testimony filed by the utility.

Uniform Rule 28-106.204(1) states that when time allows the other parties may, within seven days of service of a written motion, file a response in opposition. And, of course, Uniform Rule 28-106.103 states that five days shall be added for mailing. So the utility's response is not due until a week from today. They have until the 22nd to respond. And so right now, Staff is saying, it would probably not be best to make a ruling on those motions or to force a ruling today, unless the utility is ready to respond.

MR. DETERDING: I'm not.

MR. MCLEAN: I might add that I don't -- I

am surely not going to insist on oral argument on that particular motion, so as far as the citizens are concerned and as far as Mr. Fasano's concerned, if you want to rule in chambers, it's fine with us.

COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay.

MR. JAEGER: You don't want oral argument?

I missed what you said.

MR. MCLEAN: I didn't quite say that. I said I'm not going to insist on it. If it happens, I will be there.

COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. We'll allow the time to run for the filing of the motion or response and we'll rule then.

MR. JAEGER: Okay. I sent a draft of the prehearing order to all parties on Friday. We had a pre-pre on the 9th, last Tuesday, and I have just one change that Staff has to make. I don't know if they have any other changes or additions or not.

mr. DETERDING: Commissioner, can I speak
just for a moment to this date -- change of dates?

MR. DETERDING: I have previous plans for the 16th and 17th, to be out of town with my family. But if I have to I'll cancel, but I can't speak for any of my other people because I just found out about

COMMISSIONER CLARK: Yes, Mr. Deterding.

this 10 minutes ago. So, it's certainly inconvenient, but I'll see if we can -- I'll be there. I will find a way to be there, but I don't know whether my client and our engineer and my --

COMMISSIONER CLARK: Yes. I think we'll have to see if we can hold the hearing those dates.

MR. MCLEAN: We, of course, are faced with the same issue. We only have one witness, but I have no idea whether he is available. He normally plans his calendar out a little bit further than a few days like the rest of us do.

COMMISSIONER CLARK: Like we all do.

MR. MCLEAN: Yes, ma'am. And I may have to file some sort of objection to having it then. I don't know whether he's available or not. And when you have one witness, you'd sure love to have them there.

COMMISSIONER CLARK: I think you're right.

I think what we need to do is, let's go through the prehearing order. Get that out of the way. And then set a time certain for everybody getting back and letting us know if we can hold the proceedings on those days.

MR. DETERDING: I think Harold shares my concern, I'm sure the Staff does to; that reducing the

size of this hearing room is going to cause an awful lot of heat, most likely to come to you at that hearing, because I suspect 300 was already too small.

MR. MCLEAN: We do indeed share that concern because some of it might spill over on us.

MR. DETERDING: Not me.

MR. JAEGER: What I've been told by

Ms. Moses is we need to know in an hour and a half if

we are going to want that room on Thursday and Friday

because the people are -- and I think we've got a

deposit on the room. And if we don't take it on those

days we're probably going to lose the deposit anyhow,

but they need to know quickly if we're going to

reserve the room.

commissioner CLARK: When we leave here we'll go up to the Chairman's office and explain to him what some of our problems may be.

MR. DETERDING: I will make the phone call as soon as I get back and should be able to know something within an hour and a half, but, I mean, I can cancel. I just -- more rate case expense or whatever you want. Nonrefundable tickets.

COMMISSIONER CLARK: Well, you know, I think that point needs to be made. And we'll see -- well, when we're through here we'll go up and see about the

changes. I can make it. Has Commissioner Jacobs indicated he can make it?

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MR. JAEGER: I have not talked to

Commissioner Jacobs, and what I was trying to do is,

Sandy was scrambling to see if we could even find a

place because if she couldn't find a place then it

wouldn't be on the 16th and 17th at all. And this

happened just before lunch, and so I just have not had

a chance to even notify all the parties or all the

Commissioners.

COMMISSIONER CLARK: Is there a preference we just find another date?

MR. DETERDING: Again, I will cancel rather than find another date that's going to put us back two months. We want to get through this thing.

COMMISSIONER CLARK: You know, nonrefundable tickets you can get other places and just pay \$75 or whatever.

MR. DETERDING: I think \$75 and they'll give me a credit towards another ticket. I can cancel that. I don't know about the place I'm staying, but we'll find a way. I'm not -- it's not me. I'm not going to be the hold up because I'll find a way to be there, but I don't know about the other people.

COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. Well, after this

prehearing is adjourned I would appreciate it if you go back and contact your witnesses and find out if we can do this on those two dates. And we'll go up to the Chairman's office and indicate we may have problems. MR. JAEGER: Okay. I've asked Bob Crouch to call our DEP witnesses and so I don't know if he's gotten -- you haven't gotten ahold of them yet? don't know if even the DEP witnesses can be there. 

commissioner CLARK: All right. Well, let's go back to the prehearing order. You had a change.

MR. JAEGER: On Page 10, Staff's position on Issue 1, and it's the third -- Line 3 from the bottom of that position it says, "Staff does note that the witnesses for the DEP". And we want to change that "for the DEP", because they are Staff witnesses, but just say, "Staff does note that the DEP witnesses state". It's sort of a slight distinction. Cross out "for the DEP" and just put "DEP witnesses". That's the only change Staff had.

COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. Mr. Deterding, do you have any changes to the prehearing order?

MR. DETERDING: No, Commissioner.

COMMISSIONER CLARK: Mr. Mclean?

MR. MCLEAN: No, ma'am, I don't neither. I

1	want to point out that item I'm sorry. Issue 3
2	would probably rise or fall with your ruling on the
3	motion to strike testimony.
4	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Right. Okay. All
5	right.
6	MR. MCLEAN: Other than that, I have
