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This is a follow up to our telephone conversation concerning the past due regulatory assessment fees (RAFs), including statutory penalty and interest charges. If the company wants to keep its IXC certificate active, it must pay the past due amount in full. According to Commission records, the 1998 RAFs have not yet been paid. The amount due is based on intrastate revenues; however, the minimum due is the \$50.00 fee, \$12.50 penalty, and \$6.00 interest, for a total of \$68.50 if the payment is postmarked by January 31, 1999. The 1998 form is attached. If you owe more than the minimum (the company paid more than the minimum for previous years), the penalty is 25% of the amount due and the interest is 12% of the amount due. As information, the 1999 RAF form was mailed December 8 and payment is due by January 31, 2000. If you have not received the 1999 form yet, you may want to call Ms. Jackie Knight in the PSC's Division of Administration at (850) 413-6267 and ask that a duplicate form be sent.

In addition to the 1998 RAF and penalty and interest charges, the company also has the following past due balances: \$21.48 for 1991 (\$17.90 penalty and \$3.58 interest); \$.02 for 1993 (one cent each for penalty and interest balances); \$.01 for 1994 (one cent for penalty balance).

In addition to paying the past due amount, if the company wants to keep the certificate active, it must make a settlement offer. In other, similar cases, the Commission has accepted a \$100 settlement in lieu of the \$500 fine normally imposed for this rule violation. The settlement letter needs to include the docket number; state that it has taken steps to prevent future late payments of the regulatory assessment fees; make a specific monetary settlement; and, state that the past due amount has since been paid (after you have done so, of course). Any settlement offer should be addressed to Ms. Blanca Bayó, Director, Division of Records and Reporting, Florida Public Service Commission, at the above address. As information, the proposed settlement amount should not be paid at this time. It will become due after the Commissioners vote on this issue.
