Dear Mr. Formosa:

This letter acknowledges receipt of a notification of completion of construction for wastewater facilities from David W. Smith, P.E., Q Grady Minor and Associates, for the referenced wastewater permit.

A site inspection was conducted by the Department on September 29, 1999. The new process units were installed and the existing wastewater facility's process units converted to surge and aerobic digester capacity. The facility was in operation. During the inspection of the installation the following items were noted:

- 1. The newly installed concrete aeration basins showed signs of seepage at the sealed joints. Please review and seal as needed. Also check for seepage around pipe joints and reseal as needed.
- 2. A steady flow of effluent was leaking at a sealed joint of one of the newly installed concrete clarifiers. Please review and reseal the joint.
- 3. Secure the electrical feed line conduit that provides power to the electrical distribution panel located on the working surface of the newly installed process units.
- 4. Chemical feed system for coagulants identified in the permit application is not installed.
- 5. Multiple sections of air diffusers were not observed in the process units (Class I reliability requirement).
- 6. Back up power to operate the facility when a power outage occurs was not observed (Class I reliability requirement).
- 7. Newly installed clarifier tanks were not installed at the same level. Please provide weir level extenders so discharge weir levels between the clarifiers can be equalized.

"More Protection, Less Process"

- 8. Return activated sludge lines need to be installed as shown on the submitted drawings (Return to the first aeration basin). The returned lines as installed now need to be valved so operator can control when he wants to direct return activated sludge to the surge tanks.
- 9. The filters flow distribution box is out of alignment. A percentage of the influent flow was observed to cross over to the backwash clearwell without being filtered. Can these filters be operated independently? Class one reliability requires multiple filter units with largest unit out of service remaining unit has a capacity for at least 75 percent of design flow.
- 10. The access ladder is not aligned properly. Please revise accordingly.
- 11. Repairing or replacing steps to the existing plant is recommended.
- 12. The conversion of the existing plant's clarifier to function as an aerobic digester is not completed.
- 13. Influent and effluent sample locations were reviewed. The influent to the surge tank is received from four independent lift stations discharges. Please review and provide a common influent sample point. The effluent sample point is not easily accessible. Please review and provide an accessible sample location.
- 14. The disposal ponds require signage to identify their use and restrictions. Please reference F.A.C. rule 62. 610.468. Enclosed is a copy of the new advisory sign requirements for your guidance.
- 15. The ground water monitoring wells that were installed require certification for same. Enclosed is a copy of DEP Form # 62-522,900(3), Monitor Well Completion Report.

The facility is currently in operation and may continue to operate. However the above items need to be addressed. A follow up inspection will be conducted by the compliance/enforcement section of the Department.






