## PETITION FOR LIMITED PROCEEDING

HIGHLANDS UTILITIES CORPORATION, ("HUC"), by and through its undersigned attorneys and pursuant to Section 367.0822, Florida Statutes, files this Limited Proceeding for the purpose of recovering a 1500% increase in the cost of obtaining meter reading data for the customers in its Sebring system and in support thereof states:

1. HUC provides wastewater only service and based upon Commission policy utilizes a base facility charge rate structure. HUC obtains water meter readings from the City of Sebring which provides water service to HUC's wastewater customers.

2. At the time of HUC's last rate case in Docket No. 931052-SU, Order No. PSC-94-1234-FOF-SU issued October 11, 1994, HUC was paying the City of Sebring \$0.10 per customer per month to

The City of Sebring subsequently increased that amount to \$0.25 per customer per month.

3. The City of Sebring has notified HUC that as of January 1, 2000, the cost of meter reading data on computer disk will be \$1.50 per customer per month, and that each year it will increase by \$0.25 per customer per month. See Exhibit "A" attached hereto. The increase being currently imposed is a 1,500% increase over what the Commission approved in HUC's last rate case.

4. HUC has approximately 1,300 customers, 1,100 of which are on the Sebring system and will be subject to this increase.

5. HUC requests that it be authorized to pass through this increase by including a separate line item on its bills - similar to a franchise fee - so that the customers will clearly see the reason for this increase. Alternatively, HUC requests that it be authorized to increase its rates to its Sebring customers to recover this cost. HUC does not believe it would be fair to increase rates to the customers of its Lake Placid system to recover this fee imposed by the City of Sebring.

6. HUC also requests that any authorized increase include reasonable rate case expenses, such as the filing fee and attorneys costs.

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7. Pursuant to Rule 25-30.020(2)(g), Florida Administrative Code, the appropriate filing fee of \$1,000 is enclosed.

WHEREFORE, Highlands Utilities Corporation requests that it be authorized to increase its rates to its Sebring system customers immediately to recover the current increase, and each in the future that the City further increases the cost of obtaining meter reading data.

Dear Mr. Pugh:

The City of Sebring has been providing computer generated consumption reports to Highlands Utilities Corporation consumers for some time, at a cost of \$.25 per account. This consumption report is necessary for Highlands Utilities Corporation billing purposes.

Staff is recommending the utility processing fee be increased to \$1.00 per account, or \$1.50 per account if provided on computer disc, with a monthly increase of \$.25, beginning January 1<sup>st</sup>, of each year. It is further recommended that this agreement be reviewed in four (4) years, for any reconciliation that may be necessary. The \$1.00 or \$1.50 increase would be retroactive and appear on your next billing cycle statement.

The reason for this increase is based on two relative factors. The first is that the City has been producing the consumption report for at least seven (7) years at the same rate of \$.25 per account. The second significant factor is that the City's costs have increased over time and the cost to produce the consumption report has increased proportionately. Presently, our administrative cost per account is approximately \$2.27 and we cannot continue bearing this expense.

Finally, if the printed report and/or formatted disc for the consumption report do not meet your computer standards, we will offer some assistance. We are, however, limited in changing our internal format. Our computer analyst will help you as much as possible but any computer program changes, if available, will be borne by the user.
