Indiantown Company, Inc. was ordered in Order No. PSC-99-0376-FOF-WS, issued February 22, 1999, in the above captioned docket, to report back to the Commission in twelve months regarding customer reaction to the implementation of convergent billing. This letter constitutes that report.

There was very little comment, either for or against convergent billing after it was implemented. There were, however, a few customers who were not happy about the new method. The company has no written complaints, but there were approximately 10 - 12 customers who insisted on receiving separate bills. In response, the company immediately began to bill those customers separately for each service received, i.e., water and sewer, telephone; the company continues today to bill separately to those who ask for such billing.
