NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a hearing will be held before the Florida Public Service Commission regarding the investigation into the rates and quality of service provided by the Seven Springs Division of Aloha Utilities, Inc., at the following time and place:

10:00 a.m., Wednesday, March 29, 2000 Clarion Hotel Ballroom 5316 U.S. Highway 19 North New Port Richey, Florida

Thursday, March 30, 2000 has also been reserved for continuation of the hearing if needed. The starting time of the next day's session will be announced at the conclusion of the prior day. The hearing may be adjourned early if all testimony is concluded.

Non-party customers will be given the opportunity to present testimony at the beginning of the morning session at 10:00 a.m., Wednesday, March 29, 2000. Additionally, an evening session will

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be held beginning at 6:00 p.m., Wednesday, March 29, 2000, for the purpose of hearing testimony from customers who were unable to attend the prior session.

All customers wishing to testify are urged to be present at the beginning of the sessions, since the sessions may be adjourned early if no customers are present. By providing customer testimony, a person does not become a party to the proceeding. To become an official party of record, you must file a Petition for Intervention at least five days before the final hearing, pursuant to the requirements contained in Rule 25-22.039, Florida Administrative Code.

## PURPOSE AND PROCEDURE

The purpose of this hearing is to consider the testimony and exhibits in this investigation into the rates and quality of service provided by the Seven Springs Division of Aloha Utilities, Inc. and what actions, if any, the utility should be required to take to improve the quality of service. Any motions or other matters that may be pending at the time of the hearing may also be considered. The Commission may rule on any such motions from the bench or may take the matters under advisement.

At the hearing, all parties shall be given the opportunity to present testimony and other evidence on the issues identified by the parties at the prehearing conferences held on November 15, 1999, and March 22, 2000. All witnesses shall be subject to cross-examination at the conclusion of their testimony.

Sections 367.081, 367.0816, 367.101, 367.111, Florida Statutes, and any other relevant sections of Chapter 367, Florida Statutes, are applicable to this proceeding, as well as Chapter 120, Florida Statutes, and Rules 25-9, 25-22, 25-28, 25-30, and 28-106, Florida Administrative Code.
