## NOTICE OF PROPOSED AGENCY ACTION ORDER APPROVING WAIVER OF BOND REQUIREMENT

BY THE COMMISSION:

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN by the Florida Public Service Commission that the action discussed herein is preliminary in nature and will become final unless a person whose interests are substantially affected files a petition for a formal proceeding, pursuant to Rule 25-22.029, Florida Administrative Code.

On January 24, 2000, we received a petition seeking a waiver of the bond requirements of Rule 25-24.490(2), Florida Administrative Code, from ITC^DeltaCom Communications, Inc. d/b/a ITC^DeltaCom (ITC). The basis for seeking a waiver is set forth in the rule itself. Rule 25-24.490(2), Florida Administrative Code, states as follows:

An interexchange company may require a deposit as a condition of service and may collect advanced payments for more than one month of service if it maintains on file with the Commission a bond covering its current balance of deposits and advanced payments (for more than one month's service). A company may apply to the

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Commission for a waiver of the bond requirement by demonstrating that it possesses the financial resources and income to provide assurance of continued operation under its certificate over the long term.

This rule requires that a company maintain on file with the Commission a bond covering its current balance of deposits and advanced payments from its customers. In the alternative, the Commission may waive the bond requirement if the company demonstrates that it possesses the financial resources and income to provide assurance of continued operation under its certificate over the long run.

We believe ITC's liquidity and ability to raise funds in the public capital markets are adequate to demonstrate that it has the financial means to continue operations over the long term. Upon consideration, therefore, we find that the bond requirement in Rule 25-24.490(2), Florida Administrative Code, shall be waived for ITC.

Based on the foregoing, it is

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that the bond requirement in Rule 25-24.490(2), Florida Administrative Code, shall be waived for ITC^DeltaCom Communications, Inc. d/b/a ITC^DeltaCom. It is further

ORDERED that the provisions of this Order, issued as proposed agency action, shall become final and effective upon the issuance of a Consummating Order unless an appropriate petition, in the form provided by Rule 28-106.201, Florida Administrative Code, is received by the Director, Division of Records and Reporting, 2540 Shumard Oak Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0850, by the close of business on the date set forth in the "Notice of Further Proceedings or Judicial Review" attached hereto. It is further

ORDERED that in the event this Order becomes final, this Docket shall be closed upon issuance of a Consummating Order.

Any objection or protest filed in this docket before the issuance date of this order is considered abandoned unless it satisfies the foregoing conditions and is renewed within the specified protest period.
