# INTERVENOR FLORIDA POWER CORPORATION'S PRELIMINARY LIST OF ISSUES

Intervenor Florida Power Corporation ("FPC") files the following preliminary list of issues:

### Legal Issues

1. Does the Florida Public Service Commission ("PSC") have the statutory authority to render a determination of need under Section 403.519, Florida Statutes, for a merchant plant that does not have an agreement in place for the sale of firm capacity and energy to a stateregulated utility with a statutory obligation to serve retail customers in this State?

2. Does the Petition fail to meet the pleading requirements of Rule 25-22.081?

3. Must petitioners comply with the "bid rule," Rule 25-22.082, Florida Administrative Code?

4. Must petitioners file a Ten Year Site Plan pursuant to Rule 25-22.071, as a prerequisite to a need determination?

5. Based on the resolution of the foregoing issues, should the petitions be dismissed?

3. Is each proposed power plant the most cost-effective alternative available, as this criterion is used in Section 403.519?

4. Are there any conservation measures taken by or reasonably available to the petitioners which might mitigate the need for the proposed power plants?

5. Based on the resolution of the foregoing issues, should the petitions for determination of need for the proposed power plants be granted or denied?

6. Should this docket be closed?

# **Policy Issue**

1. Would adding either or both of the proposed merchant plants to the Florida wholesale market at this time, without a prior showing of contractual commitments to meet some identified need of particular Florida retail utilities in a cost-effective manner, serve or disserve the public interest?
