

#### O&M Benchmark Statement

Indiantown Company, Inc. has exceeded its O&M benchmark by a considerable amount and should be held accountable to explain this excess. In its benchmark schedules (B-7, B-8), the Company erroneously compares the prior test year (the year ended December 31, 1994) operating and maintenances to a pre-adjusted test year O&M that does not include all of the expenses the company is requesting in its filing.

For the water system, the total amount of O&M requested (excluding rate case expense) is \$490,434 (\$499,380 - \$8,946) this compares to the prior test year amount of \$253,468. This equates to a 95.5% increase in water O&M in just 4.5 years. By comparison, the water growth plus inflation factor for this time period is 7.18 %.

For the wastewater system, the total amount of O&M requested (excluding rate case expense) is \$726,392 (\$734,266 - \$7,874) this compares to the prior test year amount of \$312,859. This equates to a 132.2% increase in wastewater O&M in just 4.5 years. By comparison, the wastewater growth plus inflation factor for this time period is 11.22%.

While the PSC Staff has done a good job in identifying and eliminating a number of items that make up this gross excess, the recommended O&M for both systems is still unreasonably high (see schedule). Once the Commission approves this level of expense, the customers will be saddled with these unreasonable costs in all future rates. The Commission must hold this utility responsible for its own actions in not holding the line on expenses since 1994.
