## NOTICE OF INTERIM RATES

On May 15, 2000, Central Florida Gas Company (the "Company") filed a request with the Florida Public Service Commission in its Docket No. 000108-GU for approval to increase annual revenues by \$1,826,569 and requested that interim rates be put into effect pending final action on the permanent increase.

On July 11, 2000, the Commission suspended the permanent increase request and granted an interim increase of \$591,579, subject to refund, effective for billings rendered for meter readings on and after August 10, 2000, until the Commission established permanent rates. The overall interim increase of 10.87% was allocated to all customer classes of Central Florida Gas Company, as directed by the Commission.

The interim increase is spread in equal increases (excluding gas costs) for all customer classes, except Special Contracts that have previously been approved by the Commission.

The total base rate revenues produce the following interim multipliers for each rate classification.
