## CITIZENS' PETITION TO OPEN AN INVESTIGATION OF THE QUALITY OF SERVICE PROVIDED BY FLORIDA WATER SERVICES, INC. TO THE DELTONA SERVICE TERRITORY

The Citizens of the State of Florida, by and through the Office of the Public Counsel (Citizens or OPC), pursuant to Chapter 350.0611 (1), Florida Statutes, file this petition with the Florida Public Service Commission (Commission) seeking the Commission to open a docket to investigate the quality of service being provided by Florida Water Services, Inc. (Florida Water, Utility or Company) to the Deltona service territory, and state:

1. In September, 2000, it was brought to the attention of Florida Water that potable water being delivered to one or more customers in its Deltona service territory included unsavory organic contamination, namely, midge fly larvae, also known as "bloodworms".

2. In the weeks and months following the first discovery of the "blood worms", Florida Water took steps to try to identify the source of the contamination and to develop a solution to the problem.

DOCUMENT NUMBER-DATE 0 | 486 FEB-1 a FPSC-RECORDS/REPORTING 3. Notwithstanding the investigations and efforts of Florida Water, "bloodworms" continue to appear in the potable water supply of the Deltona service territory as late as January, 2001.

4. While it has not been documented that this unsavory contamination is a widespread problem, the "bloodworms" have been found in water taken from fire hydrants connected to the Company's main water transmission lines, and the contamination persists many months after first being discovered.

5. The Deltona customers of Florida Water need to be reassured that the water they are using to drink, cook and bath is safe, clean and free of unsavory organic contamination.

6. The Commission should open an investigation docket to:

a. determine the cause of the contamination;

b. determine the best solution to eliminate the contamination; and

c. verify the permanent elimination of the contamination.

WHEREFORE, for the reasons stated above, the Citizens respectfully request the Commission to open an investigation docket to accomplish all of the objectives outlined in paragraph 6 of this Petition.
