NOTICE OF PROPOSED AGENCY ACTION
ORDER CANCELLING ALTERNATIVE LOCAL EXCHANGE
TELECOMMUNICATIONS CERTIFICATE

BY THE COMMISSION:

NOTICE is hereby given by the Florida Public Service
Commission that the action discussed herein is preliminary in
nature and will become final unless a person whose interests are
substantially affected files a petition for a formal proceeding,
pursuant to Rule 25-22.029, Florida Administrative Code.

Ameritech Communications International, Inc. (Ameritech),
holder of Alternative Local Exchange Telecommunications Certificate
(ALEC) of Public Convenience and Necessity No. 4840, has requested
the cancellation of ALEC Certificate No. 4840. Ameritech has
complied with the provision of Rule 25-24.820(2), Florida
Administrative Code, by providing adequate notice in writing of its
request for cancellation of its ALEC certificate and by submitting
its Regulatory Assessment Fees (RAFs) for the year 1999.
Accordingly, we find it appropriate to cancel ALEC Certificate No.
4840, effective December 22, 2000. Ameritech shall return to this
Commission the Order granting authority to provide ALEC services.

FPSC-RECORDS/REPORTING

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The Commission is vested with jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to Section 364.335 and 364.337, Florida Statutes.

In addition, under Section 364.336, Florida Statutes, certificate holders must pay a minimum annual RAFs of \$50 if the certificate was active during any portion of the calendar year. A RAFs Return notice for the year 2000 has been mailed to Ameritech. Neither the cancellation of its certificate nor the failure to receive a RAFs Return notice for the year 2000 shall relieve Ameritech from its obligation to pay RAFs for the year 2000.

Based on the foregoing, it is

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that Ameritech Communications International, Inc.'s Certificate No. 4840 to provide Alternative Local Exchange Telecommunications services is hereby canceled, effective December 22, 2000. It is further


ORDERED that Ameritech Communications International, Inc. shall return to this Commission the Order granting authority to provide Alternative Local Exchange Telecommunications services and remit Regulatory Assessment Fees for the year 2000. It is further

ORDERED that the provisions of this Order, issued as proposed agency action, shall become final and effective upon the issuance of a Consummating Order unless an appropriate petition, in the form provided by Rule 28-106.201, Florida Administrative Code, is received by the Director, Division of Records and Reporting, 2540 Shumard Oak Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0850, by the close of business on the date set forth in the "Notice of Further Proceedings or Judicial Review" attached hereto. It is further

ORDERED that in the event this Order becomes final, this Docket shall be closed.

NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.569(1), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing that is available under Section 120.57, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing will be granted or result in the relief sought.

Mediation may be available on a case-by-case basis. If mediation is conducted, it does not affect a substantially interested person's right to a hearing.

The action proposed herein is preliminary in nature. Any person whose substantial interests are affected by the action proposed by this order may file a petition for a formal proceeding, in the form provided by Rule 28-106.201, Florida Administrative Code. This petition must be received by the Director, Division of Records and Reporting, 2540 Shumard Oak Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0850, by the close of business on February 26, 2001.

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In the absence of such a petition, this order shall become final and effective upon the issuance of a Consummating Order.

Any objection or protest filed in this docket before the issuance date of this order is considered abandoned unless it satisfies the foregoing conditions and is renewed within the specified protest period.
